





O'Carroll, who is considered a rising star of motorcycle racing, suffered severe injuries while competing in the Southern 100 in the Isle of Man in July.

The Ballyduff man has remained in the intensive care unit of the Walton Centre for Neuroscience in Liverpool since the July 8 accident and his road to recovery is going to be long and arduous.

His parents Neilus and Mary have been by his side since the accident and will continue to provide unwavering support throughout this challenging journey.

To help alleviate the immense financial burden of medical expenses and ongoing care, members of Kerry Motor Club, Ballyduff Vintage Club, No Hopers Motorcycle Club and Kerry Motorcycle Racers have come together to organise a fundraising weekend in his home village on September 13-15.

A full programme of events will be announced in due course but plans are in place to have a racing motorcycle exhibition in the community hall, a monster classic car and rally car display, and a weekend of music and entertainment. A classic car run and a motorcycle ride-out are also planned for the weekend.

Barbecues, a five-aside soccer tournament and a 5km walk will also be included in the event's schedule, opening the fundraiser to those outside the motorsport community.

"Your support is crucial. We are planning a series of events, including Q&A sessions with renowned circuit and road racers, to raise funds and awareness for Anthony's recovery," said a statement issued by the organising committee.

Several of Ireland's top road and circuit racers and rally drivers have been invited to attend the weekend-long event. Their names will be released in due course.

Weekly meetings take place at 8pm each Wednesday night at Your Man's Bar in Ballyduff and anyone interested in the event is welcome to attend meetings.

HOME MOVIE HERITAGE ON SHOW AT KERRY WRITERS' MUSEUM IN LISTOWEL AS PART OF HERITAGE WEEK 2024

We have some very exciting events taking place in Kerry Writers' Museum in Listowel in August and September as part of Heritage Week 2024

Kerry Writers' Museum puts home movies at the heart of Heritage Week with an exciting programme of FREE workshops, screenings and talks that explore the heritage value of film and digital media.

Daily screenings hosted by filmmakers celebrate a vibrant movement in story-telling-in-film that has a long history in North Kerry. beginning with travelling road shows in the 1920s and continuing at the cutting edge of Irish art and climate activism

"This is not a rural nostalgia project" according to Cara Trant, Director of Kerry Writers' Museum. "Many of the filmmakers were committed to recording life as it happened and social realism rather than nostalgia is at the heart of the stories these filmmakers tell".

The Museum received funding from the Heritage Council in 2024 to look at the management of filmed heritage assets at local level. "Since we began working on this project" adds curator Ciarán Walsh "we heard of many collections that have been lost and just as many that urgently need to be conserved. Heritage week is a good time to celebrate our home movie heritage but the serious business of protecting that heritage is just beginning."

The week includes an open access workshop on the care of personal collections. "If anyone has old film or video 'in the attic' and doesn't know what to do with it" Walsh adds "this workshop is for them".

The Home Movie Mini Festival opens in Kerry Writers' Museum on 17th August and all events are listed on the Heritage Week website:


Gripping literary mystery set in a remote Norwegian community

She has cut all ties with her family, except for her granddaughter, Elin, an outsider like her grandmother. Elin and her friend Benny, both impacted by Daniel while he was alive, become entangled in the hunt for answers, while Svea has deep, dark secrets of her own.

Brian was the son of the late Frank O'Malley, Foynes Port and nephew of Mary O'Connor. Brian died on Saturday 3 August and his Requiem Mass and interment too place in Kilcornan on Friday last 9 August.

LISLAUGHTIN ABBEY TOUR

On Monday 5 August at 2pm we were given a historical tour of Lislaughtin Abbey by Dr. Declan Downey who informed his audience that John O'Connor, Kerry was given permission by Pope Sixtus 1V to establish a Franciscan Friary.

The site was originally the site of a church dedicated to St. Lachtin of Bealachabra in Cork who died on 622 AD and who was greatly remembered by the people of the district who swore oaths by the hand of St. Lachtin. A beautiful processional cross, the Lislaughtin processional Cross which was found buried in Ballymackessy in 1871 is now in the National Museum in Dublin and is featured on the Shannonside bronzes in Tarbert. A replica of the Cross was carried by local historian Tom Kennedy at the ceremony.

Local historian Pádraig O'Concubhair gave us a history of the O'Rahilly family and their part in setting up the Irish Volunteers and the death of Michael O'Rahilly and his two comrades Patrick Shortis, Ballybunion and Michael Mulvihill, Ballyduff in the Easter Rising of 1916. Pádraig was of the opinion that the O'Rahilly's sister Anna was the forgotten heroine of Easter Week and should be better known.

DINGLE TOUR

Last Thursday 8 August some 30 members and non-members of Tarbert Historical and Heritage Society set out on a bus tour of the Dingle peninsula guided by tour guide Dr. Declan Downey. The first stop was at the Blennerville Windmill, the oldest and tallest working windmill in Ireland. We were talked through the process of the working of a windmill ascending to four floors and the processing of grain into milled flour.

The next stop was the Diseart in Dingle town, a beautiful cultural and spiritual centre with Harry Clarke stained glass windows and frescos. Then on to the Blasket Centre and a visual history of life on the Blasket islands before evacuation in 1953. Following lunch there were visits to the early monastic churches of Gallarus and Kilmalkeadar. Following an enjoyable evening meal the group returned to Tarbert, home for 10pm. While the weather was mixed, everybody enjoyed the day. A special word of thanks to Declan for a very interesting tour with a wide and varied knowledge of history, architecture, medieval trade, customs and traditions


