



Two students from Presentation Secondary School Listowel have qualified and are currently preparing for the National Final of SciFest in the Marino Institute of Education in Dublin on November 29th. Emma Heaphy and Abbie Mazzelle won the overall prize for best project in SciFest MTU Kerry in May. They are the only project from Kerry to qualify for the National Final.

The title of the project is "Would people move to an Island given the necessities" the project offers a unique solution to tackle the current housing crisis in Ireland. They have created a solution of utilising the islands around our coastline as new population centres to alleviate pressures on resources and lessen demand for housing on the mainland.

They have also looked at the environmental side of this and have produced a fully functioning sustainable island. What's more the students have received correspondence from Minister for Finance Jack Chambers and Minister for Social Protection Heather Humphreys in relation to their research.

Pat on his guitar and Kay, both in fine singing voice, were regular entertainers on parish occasions such as Senior Citizens' parties, variety concerts, tops of the parish competitions and charitable fund raisers. Their time and talents were freely available and appreciated within the community. Kay was a popular member of the local Badminton clubs in Tarbert and Moyvane. Along with other local musicians they regularly performed at the Shannon Bar in Tarbert Island. The late Father Jimmy O'Connell introduced them into his newly formed Liturgy Group. Pat and Kay established the Folk Group or Youth Choir which brought many young people into the Church and their melodious voices and musical talents were a regular weekly feature of the Saturday Vigil Mass. Pat and Kay also participated in many Church services, especially the Carol Service at Christmas, organised by St. Brendan's Church of Ireland in Tarbert.

Pat retired from the ESB in the Millenium year of 2,000 and some ten years later moved back to their native county of Wexford. Kay unfortunately suffered from accident and infirmity issues over many years. Although it is now over 20 years since they left Tarbert, the number of messages of condolence and expressions of sympathy on the death of Kay are testimony to the esteem and popularity in which this

talented duo were held during their years in Tarbert which benefitted so much from their time among us.




