



KEEPING CHILDHOOD SMARTPHONE-FREE AT GAELSCOIL LIOS TUATHAIL

In conjunction with the Safer Internet Day Feb 11th 2025 the Parents Association of Gaelscoil Lios Tuathail announces implementation of 'Keeping Childhood Smartphone-Free' Initiative

The Parents Association of Gaelscoil Lios Tuathail is thrilled to announce that a large majority of parents have voted in favour of implementing a voluntary agreement on 'Keeping Childhood Smartphone-Free.'

This initiative is in line with the Department of Education's recommendations on best practices for internet safety. After open communications, the Gaelscoil community has come together to agree that children will not have smartphones until the end of 6th class. This grassroots initiative is centered on education, open dialogue, and the overall well-being of the children.

The initiative was launched at the start of the current school year.

Background

Mobile devices and smartphones have become an integral part of the lives of children and young people. While there are benefits to these technologies, concerns remain about the risks of misuse, abuse, and potential overuse, particularly for younger children.

Smartphones and their risks have become a significant topic of discussion at schools. Many schools have either fully banned or significantly restricted smartphone use on school grounds. While this is an important step, it's essential to recognize that children are only in school for part of their day. Parents, staff, and students alike are increasingly concerned about the use of smartphones outside of school hours.

Research consistently highlights the risks associated with underage smartphone use. The recent UNESCO-funded Global Education Monitoring Report noted that "the use of technology is associated with negative impacts on physical and mental well-being, an increased susceptibility to online risks and harms, and long-term effects on academic performance."

Parents should also note that in Ireland, the Age of Digital Consent is 16.

Statement from Tadhg Beary, Chairperson of the Parents Association

Tadhg Beary, Chairperson of the Parents Association at Gaelscoil Lios Tuathail, shared, "I am incredibly proud to be part of a school community that has taken this important step to ensure our children do not have smartphones during primary school. A big thank you to all the parents who participated in the survey. It is crucial that we prioritize internet safety and follow best practices to protect our children."

Tadhg Beary also expressed the Parents Association's hope that other primary schools will consider adopting a similar approach, turning this into a wider community initiative. "Wouldn't it be wonderful if all primary schools joined this effort?" he said. "We would be delighted to share our experiences with anyone interested. Creative Ireland Kerry, through Kerry County Council's Arts Office, is pleased to announce that applications for the Creative Communities Grants Scheme 2025 are now being accepted.

The Creative Ireland Kerry Programme is a collaboration between Creative Ireland and Kerry County Council. Applications are welcome from community groups, creative practitioners and organisations for community-rooted standalone projects that incorporate creativity and culture. Through creativity we want to cultivate wellbeing in our communities, increase people's participation in and ownership of creative experiences.

Creative Communities Grant Scheme has funding of up to €6,000 available to community projects with creative aspects engagement, and a closing showcase event before October 2025.

Applications should focus on Creative and Cultural Engagement projects and must ensure a significant degree of community participation, impact, and engagement. New, ambitious, and meaningful collaborations between creative practitioners, organisations or community groups are encouraged. This year, previously successful applicants that wish to build on the impact they achieved to date, of growing creative engagement within the community, can apply to continue and build on their work by further developing creative engagement. In all applications the creative practitioner and community must be identified and be based in County Kerry.

KERRY WOMEN'S COMMEMORATION SCULPTURE OF THE REVOLUTIONARY PERIOD

In response to the tender process to develop an appropriate artwork to commemorate the women of Kerry during the revolutionary period, Kerry County Council is delighted to announce renowned Sculptor, Elizabeth O'Kane, as the successful artist.

Elizabeth O'Kane is an award-winning Irish sculptor, and a member of the Society of Portrait Sculptors. Her work can be seen in Leinster House; The European Parliament; Irish Embassies in Washington DC and London; Shannon Airport; University of Limerick; Munster Rugby, Waterford Cathedral Square, and Dublin's Iveagh Gardens.

This art commission by Kerry County Council, was tabled by its female Elected Members through a notice of motion to commemorate the role women in Kerry played during the struggle for Irish freedom between 1912 and 1923. The notice of motion acknowledged that women in Kerry contributed to the changes that shaped a new Ireland.


The brief that the artists responded to, asked them to be cognisant of the impact that events of the time had on women in Kerry. Many were actively involved in the revolution, and many more were directly or indirectly impacted by the revolutionary period. Cumann na mBan played an active role during the War of Independence and supported the anti-Treaty side during the Civil War. The first plaque dedicated to Cumman na mBan was unveiled in Knocknagoshel in March 2023, at the site of the centenary memorial monument to commemorate Dan Murphy 'The Blacksmith Volunteer'.

Cumann na Saoirse was formed in 1922 to give a platform to women who supported the Treaty. Many women in the county were not members of either organisation, but nevertheless played a vital role in the struggle for freedom. Women helped with intelligence gathering, the movement of munitions, hiding and transporting arms, distributing propaganda, sheltering volunteers, disseminating information, and caring at the frontline for the injured and bereaved. The women of the time believed strongly in the promise of the 1916 Proclamation that women should be treated equally to men and contributed to the establishment of equal suffrage.

Women in Kerry were integral to the revolutionary period. Many suffered greatly for their involvement or for their connections to others. Often women bore the direct brunt of reprisals. These women had determination, strength, resilience, and vulnerability. They were brave, committed and visionary, ideological, political, radical and propagandists. Some were reluctant, many suffered, and silence was often part of their life at the time. Many never spoke of the impact of their experiences.

Elizabeth was delighted to be awarded the sculpture commission to commemorate the Women of Kerry of the Revolutionary Period. The material for the sculpture work is bronze. The artwork will be sited in Tralee Town Park.

A call out for a residency bringing together New York and Irish artists

The County Exchange is an international residency organized by St. John's Theatre Listowel and the Irish Arts Center NYC, supported by the Arts Council of Ireland and Kerry County Arts Office is a two-part residency taking place in both Listowel, Ireland and New York, USA.

Its aim is to facilitate connections between artists from the experimental theatre, dance and performance worlds in both Ireland and New York

7 artists will be chosen (4 from Ireland, 3 from New York)

They will spend 2 weeks (May 19thth- June 2nd 2025) in Listowel, a small Irish town in North Kerry renowned for its literary heritage and 1 week (January 2026 - exact dates TBC) in the Irish Arts Center, New York. This residency is an excellent opportunity to develop an international aspect to your practice and to showcase your work to new audiences.

The awardees will be joined in Listowel by the directors of Nature Theater of Oklahoma, Kelly Copper and Pavol Liška. Kelly and Pavol, will be making time for one on one sessions with the awardees, as well as workshopping their own work during the two weeks in Listowel.

Who the Residency is for:

The residency is aimed at mid-career artists who would like to develop an international aspect to their practice. We are looking for artists who have a clear idea of the work they want to make, and how they would make use of the time and space that is provided by the residency to do that.

What the residency provides:

Accommodation and travel costs will be arranged and covered for the selected artists, and each will receive a daily subsistence allowance plus a fee of €1,000.

In Listowel, the artists will have access to multiple spaces and facilities in the town. St. John's Theatre will discuss the needs of the selected artists and will seek ways to accommodate these needs in a bespoke manner. At the end of the residency, there will be an opportunity for artists to share their work with industry peers and producers, as part of the International Listowel Writers' Week Literary Festival.

In New York, the Irish Arts Center will provide shared workspace for the 4 Irish artists.

DEATHS

The death took place of Moira Larkin (née Dowling) of Carrueragh, Knockanure and formerly of Shanaway, Tarbert. Moira who was aged 90 years died on Thursday 30 January in University Hospital Kerry. She reposed at Lyons Funeral Home, Derry, Listowel on Friday. Her Requiem Mass was celebrated in Corpus Christi Church, Knockanure by Fr. Brendan Walsh on Saturday 1 February. Her daughter Martina spoke of her mother's love of Shanaway where she grew up and how she loved to visit neighbours and friends and reminisce of times past, attending Tarmons National School and working hard on the farm. After the Requiem Mass interment took place in St Michael's Cemetery, Listowel where she was laid to rest beside her husband Sean who died in 2001. She was predeceased by her two brothers Hilary and Michael and by her sister Margaret. Sympathy of the community is extended to her four sons and her two daughters, to her sister Eileen Carmody in Dublin, to her sister Teresa Enright in Tarbert, to her extended family, neighbours and friends.

The death also took place recently in London of Michael 'Ginger' Joyce. Michael who was aged 92 years died after a short illness. He was married to Kitty Ryan from Dooncaha, Tarbert. Kitty had emigrated to England in the 1950's and she met and married Michael from Galway. They had two boys and a girl Cathy who married Amos Murray from Tarbert. Sympathy to Kitty and to the Joyce and extended families.

LÁ LE BRÍDI

On Saturday 1 February we celebrated the Feast of St. Brigid who along with St. Patrick and St. Colmcille are the three patron saints of Ireland. St. Brigid's Day traditionally marked the first of Spring. Brigid was born in Faughart outside Dundalk about 450 AD. Her father was a pagan chieftain and her mother a Christian slave. She had a very charitable nature and growing up she loved animals and gave away much of her father's goods to the poor. She founded a convent in Kildare and opened a school there, the first Christian school in Ireland. According to the Four Masters Brigid died in the year 535 AD and was buried in her own church in Kildare. The Irish Government designated a public holiday in her honour and the first Monday in February is now a public holiday. The sanctuary in St. Mary's Church, Tarbert has a very colourful wall montage of St. Brigid and the traditional St. Brigid's Cross made of rushes is displayed on the altar. The long held belief is that the cross made of rushes and blessed with holy water and displayed in the home will protect the house from fire and if displayed in farm outhouses will ensure animal health and welfare.

THE NIGHT OF THE BIG WIND

Reference has been made in recent days to the Night of the Big Wind and comparisons to recent storms. This famous or infamous storm started with a severe snow fall on the night of the 5 January 1839. The following day hurricane winds, force 12 in today's terms raged across the country. When the storm had finished up to 300 people were dead, 42 ships had sunk, hundreds of animals had been killed. Thousands of homes, mainly thatched houses were destroyed. Locally 37 ships took shelter in Tarbert Bay. The Freeman's Journal reported 'In Tarbert every house has been stripped with the exception of Miss McMahon's hotel. James Royce Yielding narrowly escaped being crushed to atoms by the fall of a chimney. The Chapel, the National School and the Church have suffered. The latter having been deprived of a pinnacle which in its fall crushed a part of its roof and otherwise damaged the interior of the building. The police barracks was demolished while the house of the Rev. Richard Fitzgerald is totally demolished. The Revenue house in Tarbert island has suffered materially and the bridge leading to the lighthouse being carried away. In and about Listowel the tempest raged with frightful violence. The loss in hay and corn has been immense. It is consoling however to find that no life has been lost. Ballybunion Castle which for centuries has withstood the fury of the elements is now a heap of ruins. Ballylongford and the farmers in its vicinity have suffered severely.' (end report) North Kerry and the country would take a long time to forget the Night of the Big Wind of 6 January 1839.




