



DISCOVER THE SECRET LIVES OF BATS ON A GUIDED BAT WALK IN FINUGE







trailer with the set for that night's performance and head to wherever that night's festival was on, it could be Charleville, Nenagh, Loughrea, Athlone or anywhere. Home was many hours away and indeed Den might have to feed the pigs when he got back. He was King of the Wrenboys and was a commanding figure with his top hat and staff. He is survived by Maria, Mairead, Helen & Tomas. Eileen Kearney of Kilbaha and formerly Ballymacelligott, passed away on March 01, wife of Mossie Michael, as he was known locally, she was a teacher during her working life. She was a kind, quiet, elegant lady, mother to Brid, Donal and twins, Maurice & Padraig. Just a few days later another neighbour of Eileen's, Paddy Kearney, left this world. A farmer he was born and reared on the family farm in Kilbaha. He was known for his incredible memory. Paddy could tell you day and date for just about anything. Being a farmer the weather was all important, he remembered when it snowed in the 70's or 80's when the bad weather prevented the silage from being cut and when it was possible to get it done early. You could say he was the memory man. He is survived by his wife, Bernie, daughters, Bernadette, Majella & Celeste, sons Pat, John & Michael. A young man, Eoin Fitzgerald of Barragougeen left this world far too soon, having been involved in a traffic accident in the UK. He was just 21. Eoin was son of James & Katie Fitzgerald, Barragougeen, brother to James Jnr., Andrew & Aoife. His main interest was tractors and farming, a pleasant, polite young man he had joined his father and brothers in the UK a couple of years ago. His funeral Mass was held in Tarbert and his burial took place in Ahavoher, Moyvane. His cortege, on its way to the graveyard, was led by his tractor which was his pride and joy. As they say every picture tells a story and this one certainly did. Young people made up much of the crowd. 

She attended Ballylongford National School and like her brothers and sisters later moved on to St. Ita's College, Tarbert popularly known as Miss McKenna's to complete her Secondary School education in the late 1950's and it was here that I first met her. Along with pupils from Ballylongford she travelled daily on the CIE bus and Miss Mckenna, the school principal facilitated this by having evening study until the bus stopped at the school gate at 8.3opm to pick up waiting pupils. Helen was witty and intelligent with a roquish sense of humour.

She later joined the Sisters of Mercy Congregation and having qualified as a teacher she was transferred to Boca Raton, Florida which she loved. She loved teaching and was later appointed Principal of St. Joan of Arc School. She had a great rapport with young people and her pupils affectionately referred to her as the General. She enjoyed coming back to Sallowglen for holidays and the treat of a 99 cone ice cream as recalled by her nephew Tim Ryan at her Requiem Mass.

Sister Ellen reposed at Arus Mhuire, Clonakilty on Tuesday 4 March. Her Requiem

Mass was celebrated by Fr. Tom Hayes assisted by Fr. Michael Curran, on Wednesday 5 March in the Church of the Immaculate Conception who remarked that in the words of the Gospel 'she had fought the good fight, she had finished the race!' Interment took place in St. Mary's cemetery, Clonakilty.

Sr. Ellen was predeceased by her sisters Sr. Jude, Bridget, Joan, Jane, and brothers Fr. Liam, Harry and Fr. Colmcille. Sympathy of the community to her sisters, Lizzie and Phil, brothers Jim and Nicholas in USA, nieces, nephews, extended family, sisters and staff in Arus Mhuire, Sisters of Mercy Congregation and many friends. There will be a Memorial Mass at a later date in St. Mary's Church, Tarbert.

Never was the uncertainty of human life reflected more so than in the tragic death of 21 year old Eoin Fitzgerald, Barragougeen, Moyvane who died in a road accident in England. He was one of four children, three boys and a girl born to James and Katie Fitzgerald, née Hayes. He was born in Middlesex where his father was working in construction. When he was a year old, his parents returned to Moyvane. He attended Ballyguiltenane National School and later Tarbert Comprehensive School. Growing up he had a fascination with tractors and all kinds of machinery, driving tractors from the age of 12. He later attended Pallaskenry Agricultural College and studied machination. He returned to England in 2021 and worked as an apprentice fitter. Tragically his very productive life with so much promise came to an end on Wednesday 21 February when he and his friend and passenger Barry O'Connell from Adare were both killed in a traffic accident.

His Requiem Mass took place on Friday 7 March in St. Mary's Church, Tarbert. There was a very large attendance with a guard of honour from the local soccer clubs. Fr. Sean Hanafin assisted by Fr. John O'Connor celebrated the Mass and Elaine Foley was the chanteuse and a eulogy was delivered by a family member.

Among the gifts brought to the altar was a photo of his two dogs, the Kerry and Celtic football jerseys, a Padre Pio medal, toy tractor and hand books, a spanner wrench. Sympathy of the community is extended to his father and mother James and Katie, to his brothers James and Andrew, his sister Aoife, his grandmother Teresa Hayes, to the extended Fitzgerald and Hayes families, friends and neighbours.


