

BRILLIANT BALLYBUNION PROJECT SELECTED FOR PRESTIGIOUS EARTH RISING FESTIVAL AT IRISH MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

What If We Were Brilliant? — a hopeful and creative project by Brilliant Ballybunion and artist Lisa Fingleton — has been selected as one of four flagship projects to feature at the prestigious Earth Rising Festival 2025 at the Irish Museum of Modern Art (IMMA) in Dublin. This marks a major achievement for the Ballybunion community and reflects the growing influence of Kerry's creative and environmental leadership on a national stage.

What If We Were Brilliant? asks how communities can be "brilliant not brutal" in the face of biodiversity loss. The project focuses on hope and creative resilience, encouraging audiences to envision more sustainable futures through art, storytelling, and community collaboration. Rooted in deep community engagement, What If We Were Brilliant? demonstrates how local creativity and resilience can inspire meaningful change. The project is supported by the Kerry Visual Artist in Residence Programme (Arts Council and Kerry County Council).

Annie Fletcher, Director of IMMA, welcomed the project's selection:

"Earth Rising is about showcasing the power of art to through creativity, imagination, and community. 'What If We Were Brilliant?' reflects the very essence of this mission. Lisa Fingleton and the Ballybunion community are showing us how creativity can foster hope and action - this is exactly the kind of work that Earth Rising is proud to support."

Lisa Fingleton also expressed her excitement:

"We're thrilled to bring the creative spirit of Ballybunion to IMMA's Earth Rising Festival. This project is about showing that hope, creativity, and community action can lead us toward a more sustainable future. We want to inspire people to believe that we can be brilliant in the face of environmental challenges."

During its presence at Earth Rising, Brilliant Ballybunion will also be showcasing work from the Ballybunion Bean Festival, which takes place from 15th to 16th August 2025. The Ballybunion Bean Festival celebrates the rich cultural and ecological heritage of the region through food, art, and community events.

Earth Rising is IMMA's annual festival dedicated to the power of art and culture. Established in 2021, the festival brings together artists, advocates, and communities to explore creative solutions to a more sustainable future. The inclusion of What If We Were Brilliant? at Earth Rising 2025 highlights the strength of Kerry's creative





Intermezzo

Sally Rooney's new book, Intermezzo, deals with the topic of family relations and how bereavement and grief deeply affect the fragile relatonship between two brothers coming to terms with the recent death of their father. The older brother Peter, who in his 30s', is a practicing lawyer in Dublin,



and although he appears quite successful, he is struggling to cope with bereavement and maintain relationships with two very different women, Sylvia and Naomi. Sylvia, a university lecturer, is a previous girlfriend whom he still loves, but who has been injured in an accident which has complicated their relationship. Naomi, on the other hand, is ten years his junior and a university student who leads a somewhat chaotic life.

In contrast, the younger brother Ivan, who is 22, is a college graduate and competitive chess player, finds social interactions difficult but nevertheless finds love through a chance encounter with an older woman Margaret. She also has a turbulent past and struggles with her family and community's views on getting involved with a younger man.

This well written and extremely perceptive book covers major life themes including loss and grief, complex sexual relationships, age differences and societal expectations, mental health and addiction, and, ultimately, redemption and healing. All handled sensitively by an author at the pinnacle of her craft.

The plant will be sited within the townlands of Kilcolgan Lower and Ralappane. The plant will consist of three 30 metre gas turbine units, a 120MW Battery storage system, a substation and underground connecting cables. The plant will feed into the national grid with a capacity to power 160,000 homes. It is expected to bring up to 500 construction jobs to the area and employ a permanent staff of 50 people. The project has been submitted by the U.S. company New Fortress Energy and will also help to secure our energy requirements and attract other investment. John Fox and Fox News will keep us informed of all developments.



For God hath not given us the spirit of fear... But of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.





