

LISTOWEL WRITERS' WEEK REVEALS HEAVYWEIGHT SHORTLIST FOR KERRY GROUP IRISH NOVEL PRIZE

Colm Tóibín, Joseph O'Connor, Donal Ryan, Niall Williams, and Christine Dwyer Hickey have been shortlisted for the 2025 Kerry Group Irish Novel of the Year Award, unveiled this week by Listowel Writers' Week. With a prize fund of €22,000 and literary prestige to match, this year's competition is one of the most exciting to date. The winner will be announced at the festival's opening night on 28th May.

Listowel Writers' Week, Ireland's oldest literary and arts festival, is proud to announce the shortlist for the 2025 Kerry Group Irish Novel of the Year Award, one of the most esteemed prizes in Irish literature. Now celebrating its 31st year, the award continues to honour exceptional fiction from Irish writers and remains a standout moment in the country's literary calendar.

Sponsored by Kerry Group, the award carries a total prize fund of €22,000, with €20,000 awarded to the winner and €500 for each shortlisted author. "Kerry Group's 31-year partnership with Listowel Writers' Week stands as a testament to our enduring belief in the power of storytelling to inspire and connect. Each year, the calibre of literary talent and vision among the shortlisted writers astounds us, and this year is no exception. ABBEYDORNEY LGFC INVITED TO COMPETE IN LONDON TOURNAMENT

As GAA season continues in earnest across the county, one North Kery ladies football club already has something very special to look forward to at the end of the year, having been invited to compete in a prestigious LGFA competition in London in September. Abbeydorney LGFC is one of just four Irish clubs invited to participate in the renowned Tara GFC/Green Build Tournament, with a group of 32 players and seven coaches travelling between September 19th and 21st.

Club chairman, Mike Moloney, explained that two U16 teams and the club's minor team will compete, in what is a huge honour for the club. He added, however, that with such a wonderful opportunity also comes a lot of expense, and the club is now looking for local support to help offset these costs and ease the pressure on the girls' families.

"While we are absolutely honoured and privileged to be invited to compete in this tournament, the trip will entail several significant expenses. At present, parents and coaches will cover the cost of flights and accommodation, but we are also hoping to kit the girls out with tournament gear and pay for their travel/transfers over the two days in London," he explained.

"With this in mind, we are reaching out to ask for the public's support to help offset these expenses, which amount to approximately €5,000. Our aim is to help make the experience as memorable and enjoyable as possible for the girls and any support would contribute greatly to fulfilling this aim and help reduce the overall costs for their families."

"This is an amazing opportunity for our girls to experience competitive football with clubs they would not normally come up against, so we are hoping that the public will row in behind us, as they have always done, to make this experience one that we will remember for many years to come." Mike said.

SENATOR MIKE KENNELLY CALLS ON GOVERNMENT TO UNGENTLY INTRODUCE CARDIAC SCREENINGS

Senator Mike Kennely, recently addressing The Seanad, has highlighted the growing number of tragic incidences of heart related deaths among our young. He is calling on Ministers and The Government to immediately implement mandatory cardiac screenings and the following are extracts from the speech...

"Relevant Ministers and the entire Government, I would like to speak on an issue of life and death - the urgent need to introduce mandatory cardiac screening for all competitive sports players between the ages of 12 and 18. Too often, we only act after the tragedy strikes. But we now have a chance to act before any further tragedy does."



"Heart conditions are among the leading causes of sudden death among young athletes. many of these conditions remain undiagnosed due to their silent nature - no symptoms, no warnings, yet the consequences can be devastating. Studies show that early detection through cardiac screening, particularly electrocardiogram (ECG) testing, can significantly reduce the risk of sudden cardiac events by identifying underlying conditions before they become fatal."

"Across the world, we see compelling evidence for preventative action. Italy's mandatory screening programme, introduced in the 1980s, has resulted in 89% reduction in sudden cardiac deaths among young athletes. It is a clear demonstration that proactive measures save lives. In contrast, Ireland lack a nationwide cardiac screening policy. While voluntary screenings are available, the reach remains limited, and many young athletes remain vulnerable simply because they never had the opportunity to be tested."

"In Ireland, around 100 young people die every year from Sudden Adult Death Syndrome (SADS) and this seems to be rising. Many of them are involved in sports. These young lives are cut short by inherited or undiagnosed conditions - silent, invisible threats that often show no symptoms until it is too late. We cannot allow a screening programme to depend on tragedy for action. We need to prevent these incidents - not just respond to them."

"Sports organisations and charities have stepped up where policy has lagged behind. The Dillon Quirke Foundation, established after Dillon's sudden death during a hurling match in 2022, has already screened over 10,000 young people, identifying 243 who require further cardiac evaluation. These screenings have undoubtedly saved lives, but no family should have to rely on charity alone for protection."

"If we require gum shields and helmets to safeguard our children from physical impact, why do we not check the organ most vulnerable and under pressure - their hearts? The cost of inaction is measured in lost lives, grief-stricken families, and communities devastated by preventable tragedies."

"I am calling the Minister for Heath, the Minister for Sport and The Government as a whole to introduce legislation that would make cardiac screening, including ECGs, mandatory for all competitive sports participants between the ages of 12 and 18. This must be nationwide, State-supported programme, developed in partnership with schools, sports bodies and medical professionals."

"Furthermore, we must ensure that this programme is accessible to all, regardless of socioeconomic background. It should not be a privilege - it must be right. Screening should be integrated into routine health checks for young athletes, creating a culture of prevention rather than reaction."

"We owe it to the families who have lost loved ones - and to those who could be spared the heartbreak - to act now, before another young life is lost."

Kerry Writers' Museum Launches Groundbreaking Exhibition Celebrating the Women Who Shaped Kerry's Literary Legacy

Kerry Writers' Museum is proud to announce the launch of its new permanent exhibition, Kerry Women in Literature, officially opening on Wednesday 28th May at 6pm. This Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport & Media-funded exhibition honours generations of Kerry women whose voices, stories and lived experiences have profoundly shaped Ireland's literary and cultural landscape.

WEDNESDAY 28" MAY AT 6P Kerry Writers' Museum, Listow

The exhibition features thirteen writers whose contributions span centuries, genres, and social backgrounds - including nationalist and children's author Máirín Cregan, playwright and short story writer Siobhán Ní Shúilleabháin, and civil servant and dramatist Pauline Maguire. Also included are lesserknown yet culturally significant figures such as Mary Downing, an active nationalist poet known by the pen name "Christabel," and Anne Margaret Rowan, historian, novelist, and campaigner against Home Rule.

Through a dynamic and multidisciplinary format, Kerry Women in Literature interweaves biography and newly commissioned visual artworks by five contemporary artists.

- Each artist interprets the life and work of a specific Kerry writer:
 - Damian Daly evokes the lyrical precision of Sonja Broderick, whose poetry elevates everyday experience through evocative imagery and rhythm.
 Aidan O'Leary brings to life the psychological and historical tension in the fiction
- Aidan O'Leary brings to life the psychological and historical tension in the fiction of Anne Margaret Rowan through atmospheric mixed media.
- Myfanwy Frost-Jones explores themes of land, lineage, and feminine power in a film work inspired by Eibhlin Dubh Ni Chonaill.
- **Roisín McGuigan** reflects on communication and resistance in her tribute to Máirín Cregan, blending printmaking and political symbolism.
 - Ciara Tuite creates an abstract landscape echoing Peig Sayers' raw accounts of hardship and resilience on the Blasket Islands.

The exhibition is curated by **Louise Lynch**, a leading visual artist and curator in Kerry. Louise's curatorial vision ensures that each writer's story is given visual form, bridging art and literature in meaningful ways. With a strong track record at St. John's Theatre & Arts Centre, the Listowel Visual Artists' Collective, and Kerry Writers' Museum, her work continues to spotlight local creativity with depth and nuance.

The museum also pays tribute to its Executive Director, **Cara Trant**, whose ongoing leadership has transformed Kerry Writers' Museum into a recognised centre of excellence. Her work in securing vital funding, nurturing creative partnerships, and prioritising female representation has made initiatives like Kerry Women in Literature possible.

This permanent exhibition is not only an artistic and cultural milestone - it is an invitation to rediscover the women of Kerry who wrote, resisted, imagined, and recorded the world around them. Their stories live on in the words they left behind and now, through this vibrant new exhibition, in the visual responses they continue to inspire.



The death took place of Tommy McGovern, Ballinaboula, Dingle and Tarbert. Tommy who had not been in good health recently died on Sunday 27 April at UHK, Tralee. He reposed at O'Connor's Funeral Home, Dingle on Tuesday 29 April. His Requiem Mass was celebrated by an tAthar Eoghan O'Cadhla, Sagart Paróiste, Baile an Fheirtéaraigh, a relation of the Kiely family, Tarbert, on Wednesday 30 April. Noreen was laid to rest beside her late husband Finbar in St. Mary's New Cemetery. John Dowling sang 'The old home place', Pete Kiely played Finbarr's favourite song 'Way down in the County Kerry' on his accordeon and John Carrig, Askeaton sang 'Noreen Bawn' as we said our farewells.

D-DAY

Tuesday of this week was June 06 and the anniversary of the landing on the beaches in Normandy in 1944, probably the most important day in the history of the world. Never forget the holocaust and the millions of people who died at the hands of Adolf Hitler and his cohorts. It is now 81 years since it happened and most of those who suffered at the hands of Hitler and his generals have now passed away. Among the few still alive is Tomi Reichental who has been living in Ireland since 1959. He was born in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia, now Slovakia in 1935, and he and his family were deported to Bergen-Belsen concentration camp in 1944 where he lost 35 members of his close family. Knockanure has a very important connection with this event. D-Day had been planned for 24 hours earlier. A 21 year old young lady from Knockanure, Maureen Flavin, was Post Mistress & operator in the weather station in Blacksod Bay, Co. Mayo. She took hourly barometer readings throughout the day and night and her readings showed a storm approaching from the Atlantic on June 03. Maureen phoned an urgent report to the British Meteorological Office in London and got a call back to check the readings again. She confirmed "Force six wind and a rapidly falling barometer". It is said that Winston Churchill even phoned Maureen to make sure and she confirmed that the storm was on the way bringing hazardous winds and poor visibility. Eisenhower took the decision to postpone the D-Day landings for 24 hours. 5,000 ships and 11,000 aircraft had transported 156,000 troops ready for the offensive at Normandy. In the early hours of June 05 another report from Blacksod confirmed that the cold front had passed and the rest is history As she said later in her life "They could arrange everything but they couldn't prearrange the weather". Maureen Flavin Sweeney had a very long life only leaving this world last December. I hope she realised how many lives she saved, probably 150,000 or more. Her's is a life that should not be forgotten and should be commemorated locally. Congratulations to the Flavin family, Knockanure. Remember her with pride.
