

The Listowel Visual Artists' Collective (LVAC) is proud to present its most ambitious collaborative exhibition to date, Our Land, Our Story, launching to coincide with this year's Listowel Literary Festival presented by Kerry Writers' Museum, Listowel Writers' Week & St. John'S Theatre & Arts Centre. This powerful multidisciplinary showcase celebrates the rich tapestry of local voices — visual and literary — with over 70 artists, poets, and writers contributing original work inspired by a shared theme.



Curated by LVAC co-founder and artistic visionary Louise Lynch, the exhibition captures the spirit of community, place, and storytelling. Louise's unwavering commitment and curatorial direction remain the cornerstone of LVAC's growing presence and influence in North Kerry's creative scene. Our Land, Our Story features visual artworks by LVAC members that respond to the landscape, history, and identity of our homeplace. These works then serve as inspiration for an exciting literary collaboration — local poets and writers have created original written pieces in direct response to the artwork, which will also be on display, offering a unique dialogue between visual and literary storytelling. The exhibition will be officially opened by Billy Keane, and will be available to view until the end of June in St. John's Theatre & Arts Centre

In addition to this major exhibition, Louise Lynch has also curated the Kerry Women in Literature exhibition in Kerry Writers' Museum, that will be officially opened during the festival. This permanent exhibition celebrates the legacy of Kerry's literary women — from household names like Peig Sayers to lesser-known yet equally significant figures — through an immersive blend of history, literature, and visual art. We are especially proud to highlight that LVAC member Damian Daly is one of five artists commissioned to create original work for the Kerry Women in Literature exhibition. Damian's contribution is inspired by poet Sonja Broderick, whose ability to find magic in the everyday is mirrored in Damian's own layered, symbolic painting style. His work explores themes of memory, imagination, and the quiet wonder in ordinary life—bringing Sonja's poetic lens to vivid life.

In a further celebration of visual art, LVAC artist Shayne Mangan will showcase a selection of his Listowelinspired work at Kerry Writers' Museum from late May through June. Shayne's expressive style also features as the cover art for this year's literary festival programme- a fitting tribute to his growing artistic profile.

We also extend a special thanks to Olive Stack of Olive Stack Art Gallery, a longstanding champion of both local and international talent. Olive's ongoing dedication to the arts has made her gallery a cornerstone of North Kerry's creative landscape and a vital contributor to Listowel's identity as a vibrant hub for visual arts.

To round off the week of creativity, LVAC will host a pop-up shop on William Street, where members will exhibit and sell a vibrant selection of arts and crafts. These four locations—St. John's Theatre, Kerry Writers' Museum, Olive Stack Art Gallery, and the pop-up shop—will form the LVAC Art Trail: a town-wide celebration of creativity that brings art into everyday spaces and invites the community to engage with the visual arts.

This growing collaborative project transforms spaces across Listowel, showcasing the incredible talent within our vibrant and inclusive community of artists." — Louise Lynch, Curator and Co-Founder, Listowel Visual Artists' Collective.


WRITING SUCCESS CONTINUES IN PRES LISTOWEL

OVER 750 PEOPLE ATTEND DARKNESS INTO LIGHT WALK IN MOYVANE

What a morning in was last Saturday 10th May when Moyvane hosted Darkness Into Light for the very first time. The event, which was first held with 400 people attending the Phoenix Park in Dublin in 2009 now regularly sees 150,000 people walking across hundreds of Irish venues. Moyvane was one of only 3 new routes chosen in 2025, and what an event it was. In excess of 750 people descended on The Boro in the early hours of the morning to begin the walk at 4:30am. This was a community event in every sense of the word with people from all ages and backgrounds lending a hand to ensure it's success.

Back in February a group of 13 people got together to form a committee and from there on the wheels were set in motion. As time went on more people joined in to lend a hand from catering to music, from photography to getting the route ready. Before the walk the local choir treated people to songs from the Darkness Into Light soundtrack. The song most associated with the event "You'll Never Walk Alone" was played before

local man and committee member Tom O' Connor cut the tape to officially start the event. The route took people from the community centre up around the Creamery, down to Annamoy Bridge. A surprise addition was a walk into the lime kiln only made possible by a group of people making the entrance safe, a real Meitheal as the old Irish saying goes. Following this people entered the woods, which was delightfully lit to ensure a fantastic ambience. The route continued on the walkway around Moyvane GAA field and back the road to the community centre. One of the medical team on first aid duty at the Creamery commented that it was like a mass of fans descending on Croke Park when the group rounded Brosnan's corner headed towards them. A sea of yellow walked in unison to support Pieta as they strive to ensure free services remain for those in need due to suicidal thoughts or self harm. Dawn was breaking with a fabulous rendition of the dawn chorus as people completed the route. Following the walk people joined together in the community centre to chat while a vast array of refreshments was ready to be served.

News has already come through that Moyvane will again host Darkness Into Light in 2026 and it is sure to be bigger and better knowing the enthusiasm that was generated this year. 
