



#### NIALL WILLIAMS WINS 2025 KERRY GROUP IRISH NOVEL OF THE YEAR

Listowel Writers' Week is proud to announce that Niall Williams has won the 2025 Kerry Group Irish Novel of the Year Award for his novel Time of the Child.

Now in its 31st year, the award remains one of the most esteemed literary honours in Ireland, celebrating outstanding Irish fiction with a prize fund of €22,000 - €20,000 awarded to the winner and €500 for each shortlisted author. It is sponsored by Kerry Group, whose long-standing partnership continues to elevate and honour Irish literary excellence.

Catherine Keogh, Chief Corporate Affairs Officer at Kerry Group, praised the continued partnership with Listowel Writers' Week. "Every year, the calibre of writing reminds us why Ireland continues to lead on the global literary stage," she said. I don't remember the last time I read a book that made me stop, so frequently, unable to continue until I had savoured a sentence. He is an extraordinary writer and a worthy winner of the Irish Novel of the Year."

The winner was announced at the opening night of the Listowel Literary Festival, a major celebration of literature that features events with acclaimed writers, panels, workshops, and performances across Listowel.



In 1979, Liam and his brother, Kieran, played starring roles on a remarkable Beale minor team that achieved the rare feat of winning a clean sweep of competitions - the County League, the North Kerry Championship and the North Kerry League. That talented squad was guided by none other than their father, Liam Lynch (senior), making it a truly special chapter in the Lynch family's link

Liam and many of his minor teammates went on to shape one of the most successful eras in Beale's history during the club's cherished Golden Years of the 1980s. The Lynch family's connection to Beale GAA runs deep. Liam's sister, Lillian, also proudly represented the club. Lining out at wing forward, she played a key role when Beale Ladies secured the County Intermediate Championship in the early 1980s.

Liam will be remembered not just for his skill on the field, but for the kind, friendly and warm-hearted man he was. 
