

The much anticipated five-a-side 2-teacher final produced some excellent passages of football and was indeed much more competitive than the score suggests. Shrone NS were playing in the school's third consecutive final in search of the elusive county title, and they played their hearts out. However, they were repeatedly punished with counter-attacks from an all round more balanced Brosna NS team who had top performances throughout the field. In Sarah Leahy, Brosna look to have a future star. She was lethal in front of goal, defended heroically, fielded from the clouds and was clever and economical with possession. She got excellent assistance from Ciara Horgan and Alice O'Keeffe on the scoring front, reliable goalkeeper Ellie Buckley and lively defender Ava Linehan.

For Shrone NS, goalkeeper Clodagh Cahill was in brilliant form and was outstanding with her kick-outs. In the O'Sullivan sisters Isabella and Grace they had top class players. The sisters worked their socks off in all areas of the field but they and their team mates, who have developed so much as footballers in the past three to four years, encountered a competent Brosna team on the day .lna. History was made at Austin Stack Park as Gneeveguilla NS were crowned 4/5 Teacher county champions for the first time. The game got off to a lively start with Coolard's Síun Kennelly opening the scoring with a composed point. Gneeveguilla replied immediately as Amelia Fleming finished confidently to the net. Another Kennelly free reduced the gap, but Gneeveguilla were quick to respond, with Sinéad Hurley firing home their second goal. Coolard kept pressing and were rewarded with a fine point from Orla O'Rahilly. However, Gneeveguilla began to pull away when midfielder Aisling Fenton struck for her side's third goal, followed by a point from Hurley to stretch the lead.

A free from Kennelly and a long-range point from Orla Lyons kept them within reach. Gneeveguilla's response was swift Aisling Fenton added a free, and Sinéad Hurley split the posts with a superb long-range point to give her side a commanding 3-4 to 0-5 lead at half-time.

Orla Lyons got Coolard off the mark in the second half with a point that briefly raised hopes. But Sinéad Hurley soon dashed any hope of a comeback, netting her second goal with a blistering run through the defence. Coolard battled on, and a sweeping move upfield ended with Sophie O'Flaherty finding the net. Gneeveguilla weren't done yet. Ava Knee capped off a brilliant team move with a fifth goal, putting the result beyond doubt. Sinéad Hurley then put the icing on the cake with a stunning point off the outside of her boot, rounding off a Player of the Match performance.

As the final whistle blew, Gneeveguilla's supporters celebrated a historic victory, one that emptied the village as the community turned out in full force to witness the occasion. This was a performance built on teamwork, skill, and no shortage of talent. Though defeated, Coolard NS can hold their heads high after a valiant effort. Remarkably, it was their second county final appearance in just a matter of weeks, having also reached the Girls' Mini 7s decider, where they narrowly lost out to Rathmore NS.

The match began in a whirlwind of action, with Tarbert's goalkeeper called into action early and often, pulling off a series of fine saves to keep her side in the game. Despite the early pressure, it was Currow who eventually broke the deadlock through Megan Brosnan, who slotted over a composed point. Moments later, Currow struck for their opening goal. Bella Clifford turned provider, showing







great vision to pick out Megan Brosnan, who made no mistake as she fired the ball into the Tarbert net. Tarbert responded with their first point courtesy of Holly Mulvihill, followed closely by a well-taken free from Ava Mulvihill. Máire Curtin added a fine point before Clifford made one of her trademark darting runs and finished clinically past the Tarbert keeper to extend the lead. From there, Currow were rampant. A pair of points each from the in-form Maire Curtin and Bella Clifford pushed them well ahead, and by the half-time whistle, they held a commanding lead of 2-7 to 0-2. Straight from the throw-in, Máire Curtin surged forward and found the back of the net once again, showing their relentless intent. Bella Clifford added two more points to her growing tally, while Máire Curtin continued to impress with another brace of scores. Then came Tarbert's late comeback, giving the game a thrilling finish. A late surge from the North Kerry side saw them convert four goals, injecting renewed energy into the contest. Ava Mulvihill produced a remarkable hat trick of goals, while Anna Holme added a well-taken goal of her own to cap off Tarbert's second-half rally. However, the deficit proved too great to overcome. As the final whistle sounded, the Currow players celebrated a thoroughly deserved victory after a superb all-around team performance.

SHANNON WAY TRAIL UPGRADE OFFICIALLY UNVEILED DURING ASDEE FESTIVAL CELEBRATION



The Shannon Way Trail marked a significant milestone last week with the official opening of its recently completed upgrade works from Tullahinell to Larha, celebrated as part of the local Asdee Village Festival. The work was carried out as the next phase of renovation for the trail, following on from the great work carried out by the Asdee community in recent years. The event highlighted a renewed commitment to enhancing outdoor recreation, local connectivity, and natural amenities for residents and visitors alike.

Hosted by Asdee Community Development Ltd, the event welcomed a distinguished group of guests including a Kerry County Councillor, Kerry County Council Management and Staff, Local Landowners, and key community stakeholders who were first involved in the initial upgrade works back in 2021—each of whom played an essential role in the success of the project.

John Kennedy, Chairperson, Asdee Community Development Ltd., comments "This project represents what can be achieved through partnership, vision, and a shared love for the outdoors. The Shannon Way Trail upgrade is part of a broader initiative to enhance the trail from Ballybunion to Tarbert.

The upgraded section of the Shannon Way Trail offers improved accessibility, safety, and enjoyment for walkers and those interesting in hiking trails, please be mindful to wear appropriate footwear and respect the land you are passing through.

Following the formal opening, guests and members of the public joined in a community walk along the enhanced trail, which served as a highlight of the wider Asdee Village Festival celebrations. People got to experience the improvements firsthand.

BALLYBUNION RACES INTO SUMMER!

Dair Don't miss the Thunder of Hooves!

Rahavanig, Ballybunion is the place to be on Sunday, as the white flag is set to rise on another exciting day of horse and pony racing. Owners, jockeys and racing enthusiasts from across the region will take part in what promises to be a thrilling occasion.

With roots stretching back nearly two centuries, the Ballybunion Races are steeped in heritage. Hooves thunder and history lives on almost 200 years at Ballybunion Races. The very first race meeting in Ballybunion took place in 1832, when horses set off from the caves on the Ladies' Strand, galloped to Kitty's River on the Long Strand, and thundered back towards a winning post, marked by a black pole aligned with The Castle. The day's highlight was the Speak Easy Cup, with a prize of five sovereigns, claimed that year by a horse named The Dodger.

Subsequent gatherings moved to Ballyeigh Strand, where spectators enjoyed a mix of games, riding contests and even a pre-arranged faction fight. The most notorious of these skirmishes erupted on 24th June 1834. History has it that, due in no small part to the disturbances surrounding these faction fights, the meeting at Ballyeigh was suspended and by 1856, after the final Ballyeigh fixtures on 9th and 10th September, records show that horse racing found its new home in Listowel. The inaugural Listowel meeting in 1858 launched a tradition that endures to this day.

The great tradition was revived again on Ballybunion Beach in 2019 and hosted in a field in Ballyeigh in 2023 - the story has come almost full circle! From the beach to the field, the spirit of racing gallops on this year in Rahavanig, less than two miles outside town.

So, whether you're a racing enthusiast or simply looking for a great family day out, feel the thunder of hooves and the unmistakable buzz of race day in Ballybunion on Sunday. The first race is off at 1 o'clock.




