Welcome to San Rita Wellness weekly column...We hope all is good with you, below is our weekly column for this week.

Let's not blame certain events for our eating mishaps.

This week we want to chat a little bit about blaming a situation, a person or a place for our eating mishaps. Now that we are all able to socialize more now, whether it is a night out, a night away or catching up with friends .But we really have to watch these little misdemeanors to not undo all our good work. In fact we really want to improve on our weight loss and come out the other side healthy and happier. So let's talk about moderation today.
