





## SENATOR MIKE KENNELLY WELCOMES VISIT OF MINISTER KEVIN "BOXER" MORAN TO LISTOWEL

#### and Confirms Flood Relief Works will commence ahead of Listowel Races

"I am pleased to confirm that Minister of State with responsibility for Flooding through the OPW, Kevin "Boxer" Moran, will visit Listowel next week in response to long-standing concerns about flooding in North Kerry—particularly in the Listowel and Kilocrim areas.

The Minister's visit comes at a critical time as we prepare for the upcoming Listowel Races, a cornerstone event in our town's calendar. I can now confirm that, following consistent engagement between my office, local officials, and the Office of Public Works, flood relief works will commence in the coming weeks, with preparatory phases beginning before the festival kicks off.

This commitment is a direct response to the devastating flooding experienced on November 24, 2025, when our communities in Listowel and Kilocrim endured the most destructive flood event in recent memory. That night, the emergency response evolved rapidly from saving homes to saving lives, as water levels rose beyond any expectation. Homes were destroyed, businesses devastated, and families displaced. The emotional and financial scars from that flood are still felt today.

This project represents more than infrastructure—it is about restoring confidence and security to families and businesses who have lived under constant threat from future flooding.

Minister Moran's visit next week is a welcome recognition of the urgency and seriousness of the situation. I will personally accompany him during his engagements with local residents and stakeholders to ensure the concerns of the community are fully heard and addressed.

We cannot undo the damage of November 2025—but we can and must take action to ensure such a disaster never happens again.

This is a vital step in that direction, and I will continue to work closely with the OPW, Kerry County Council, and Minister Moran to ensure this project is delivered effectively and without delay.

Begin the trail at Gunter's Pottery or join in at a point of interest on one of many stops along the way.

#### **SAN RITA WELLNESS**

Welcome September. This week is the start of a new routine in the house for many of us as children have started back to school. While it can be exciting for them it can also be a bit scary.
