## An Accidental Villain:

#### **By Linden MacIntyre**

From the bestselling author Linden MacIntyre comes an engrossing exploration of one of the most significant, but nearly unknown figures of the Irish War of Independence, Sir Hugh Tudor. Tudor left few traces of his time in Ireland. No diary or letters explain his record as commander of the notorious Black and Tans or justify his role in Bloody Sunday, November 21, 1920. And why did a man knighted for his efforts in Ireland leave his family and homeland in 1925, moving across the sea to Newfoundland?

In An Accidental Villain, Linden MacIntyre delivers a fascinating account of how events can bring a man to the point where he acts against his own training, principles and inclination in the service of a cause - and ends up on a long journey towards personal oblivion.

## BUDGET 2026

A PICK & MIX APPROACH!

## **OVERVIEW**

With the economy facing an international headwind, the budget represents a more cautious approach. The much-muted VAT rate reduction to 9% for Food, Catering and hairdressing sector has been introduced but only from the 1st July 2026. For most businesses the increase in minimum wage will negate the benefit, but given it's a permanent change will be widely welcomed.

Aside from increases in social welfare and those who benefit from 9% VAT rate it offers little to individuals, farmers and other sectors who are largely ignored. The Budget focuses on job protection and international growth but is unlikely to prove popular in more rural communities.

## SUMMARY MAIN POINTS

The main discussion points in the budget were as follows:

- VAT Rate reduction from 13.5% to 9% from July 2026
- Minimum wage increased by 65c to €14.15 per hour
- No change to Main Personal Income Tax Rate or Tax Credits.
- Cigarettes increasing by 50c per pack
- · Tax on Vapes 50c per millilitre
- Main Welfare payments increased by €10 per week

## PERSONAL TAXATION

- No change to Main Personal Income Tax Rate or Tax Credits.
- USC rate of 2% rate band raised by €1,318 to €28,700
- Rent tax credit extended for three years.
- Mortgage Interest tax Credit Extended to 2026

## SOCIAL PROTECTION

- Main Welfare payments increased by €10 per week
- Christmas payments double for one week in December
- Child Benefit Increased by €16 over 12/ €8 under 12
- Domiciliary Care Allowance increased by €20 to €380 per month
- Weekly Fuel allowance increased by €5 to €38

## Housing

- €5bn Capital Investment for delivering new homes
- VAT rate on the sale of completed apartments will reduce from 13.5% to 9% until December 2030.
- Derelict property Tax of 7% Market Value to be Introduced in 2027 replacing Derelict Site Levy

## **FARMING**

- Flat rate addition for VAT reduced from 5.1% to 4.5%
- . €20 million increase in Acres Scheme
- €85 million additional for Bovine TB Eradication

## BUSINESS

- VAT reduction from 13.5% to 9% from July 2026
- Minimum wage increased by 65c to €14.15 per hour
- · Pension Auto Enrolment to start January 1, 2026
- Extension of 9% reduced VAT rate for gas and electricity

## MOTORING

- The €10,000 Benefit-in-Kind (BIK) on the Original Market Value for electric cars will remain for 2026 reducing to €5,000 in 2027, €2,500 in 2028 and end in 2029.
- Carbon Tax for Petrol and Diesel will increase from €63.50 to €71.00 per tonne.

## CAPITAL GAINS TAXES/ OTHER

 Entrepreneurial Relief reformed and extended from €1 million to €1.5million

## **EDUCATION & CHILDCARE**

- Annual student contribution fee in third level will be permanently reduced by €500
- Back-to-school clothing and footwear allowance has been extended to 2 and 3-year-olds.






