COLÁISTE NA RÍOCHTA STUDENTS CELEBRATE DOUBLE SUCCESS AT KERRY ENTERPRISE AWARDS

Students from Coláiste na Ríochta, Listowel, are celebrating a major achievement after securing a double win at the Kerry Student Enterprise Awards, held at MTU on March 13th.

The school was honoured with the Best School Award, while students also claimed the Best Use of the Irish Language (Duais Gaeilge), marking a proud day for the entire school community.

The winning project, Little Heroes, was developed by David Hunt and Katie Stack from Fifth Year, along with Sinéad Buckley, Izzie Griffin and Layla Stack from Transition Year. Their impressive business plan captured the judges' attention for its powerful focus on inclusion, creativity and sustainability. Little Heroes creates inclusive and sustainable teddy bears designed to represent a wide range of life experiences and illnesses. Each bear carries its own story and purpose, promoting the positive message that being different is what makes each of us special. By collecting and redesigning donated teddies, the students give each one a new lease of life while creating meaningful companions for children.

The project is a strong example of STEAM education in action, combining technology, creativity and environmental awareness. The students made use of 3D printing, sewing and graphic design, while also incorporating elements of Gaeilge and Irish Sign Language, further underlining their commitment to inclusion and education.

Speaking after the awards, the students said they were delighted to represent their school and proud to see their hard work recognised at county level. They also expressed sincere thanks to their teacher, Mr Cathal O'Mahony, and SNA Mr Seán Maunsell, for their continued support and guidance throughout the project.

Principal Iseult Glynn praised the students' achievement, highlighting the way the project successfully combined enterprise with the Irish language, sustainability, disability awareness, inclusion and modern technology, including 3D printing and graphic design. "This success reflects the creativity, compassion and innovation of our students," she said. Congratulations to all involved on an outstanding achievement.



NEW BILL TARGETS RISING THEFT OF TOOLS FROM TRADESPEOPLE AND APPRENTICES

Senator PJ Murphy has this week initiated the release of the Criminal Justice (Theft and Fraud Offences) (Amendment) (Work Equipment) Bill 2026, a legislative proposal designed to tackle the growing problem of tool theft affecting tradespeople and apprentices across Ireland. The Bill is co-signed and strongly supported by Senator Mike Kennelly and Senator Mark Duffy.

The proposed legislation responds to what has become a widespread and damaging issue. Recent research indicates that more than 70% of tradespeople have experienced tool theft, with half reporting losses of over €3,000. For apprentices, many of whom earn below minimum wage while paying for training, accommodation, and transport- the financial impact can be devastating. In many cases, stolen tools mean an immediate inability to work, earn, or continue training.

The Bill introduces a minimum custodial sentence of 36 months for adults convicted of theft, burglary, aggravated burglary, robbery, or handling stolen property where the offence involves work equipment essential to a person's employment. It also restricts the extent to which such sentences may be suspended. The aim is to ensure that those who deliberately target tradespeople face penalties that reflect the seriousness of the harm caused.

Senator Kennelly highlighted that these crimes are far from opportunistic. "These individuals knowingly deprive hardworking men and women of their ability to earn a living. Their actions are calculated, intrusive, and deeply harmful," he said. Many offences occur at or near people's homes, representing not only a financial loss but a significant invasion of privacy and security.

The Bill underscores the essential role tradespeople play in meeting Ireland's housing and infrastructure needs and affirms the State's responsibility to protect their livelihoods.

By strengthening deterrents and recognising the severe impact of these crimes, the legislation seeks to support workers, safeguard apprentices, and uphold the principle that work must be respected and protected.

Senators Murphy, Kennelly, and Duffy commend the Bill to the Oireachtas and call for swift progress to ensure meaningful protection for tradespeople nationwide.

HELP REBUILD BLOOD SUPPLIES FOLLOWING EASTER - LISTOWEL CLINIC

As we exit the busy Easter period, the need to rebuild blood stocks is especially important. 2026 has seen a spike in demand for blood. 22,918 units of blood were issued to hospitals in the first two months of 2026. The Irish Blood Transfusion Service is asking donors both existing & first time to attend these upcoming local clinics.

When You Can't Donate, You Can Still Save Lives – Encourage Someone Who Can.




We are so grateful to Marina Cahill for taking on this feat and nominating Kerry Hospice Foundation as one of her chosen charities.
