CALL FOR GOVERNMENT TO WAIVE 2026 STATE EXAM FEES AMID COST-OF-LIVING PRESSURES

This week in the Seanad, Senator Mike Kennelly called on the Government to waive the student exam fees for the 2026 Junior Cycle and Leaving Certificate exams in light of the ongoing cost-of-living and energy crisis.

Working families must be protected.

For 2026, students are being asked to pay €109 for the Junior Cycle and €116 for the Leaving Certificate.

While these amounts may appear modest, they place a real and unnecessary burden on families already struggling with rising household costs.

This pressure is even greater for families with more than one child sitting State exams.

We know from recent experience that these fees can be removed without any impact on the smooth running or high standards of the examinations.

During the pandemic, when fees were temporarily waived, the system operated effectively, and students were able to focus fully on their studies.

In light of this, Senator Kennelly is calling on the Minister for Education to consider waiving the State exam fees for 2026. This measure would offer genuine relief to working families, reduce stress for students, and allow them to concentrate on achieving their full potential.

Supporting our young people in this way is fair, constructive, and timely.

It would send a clear message that accessibility and opportunity in education remain national priorities.



LISTOWEL YOUTH FILM GROUP WIN BIG AT NATIONAL AWARDS

Fis na hÓige, Listowel's youth film group, won big at the Fresh Film Festival Awards in Dublin on Thursday, March 26.

The awards honoured the finest in Irish teenage filmmaking over the past year, with Fis na hÓige nominated in multiple categories for their films "Life in Listowel" and "Space Dog".

"Life in Listowel", which looks at the past, present, and future of the town through four unique voices, was awarded the esteemed Radharc Award for Best Documentary Film. 

EASTER STUDY REVISION PLAN (LEAVING CERT)

By James Kenny is a retired Guidance Counsellor and has taught at both primary and second level.

The Easter break is an ideal time to focus on intensive study, as it is the longest break before the Leaving Cert.

I have created a seven-hour daily study plan, which is realistic and achievable because it includes regular breaks. The aim is to study smart by using short bursts of focused, intensive work followed by rest periods.

Here are some general guidelines:

- Use the State Examinations Commission to see past papers and marking schemes.
- Shut down your phone and keep it out of sight. Phones are the enemy of study.
- Focus on Active Learning and test your recall
- Do not cram everything in one go
- Practice Past Papers

This is one of the most effective strategies.

- Set Specific, Realistic Goals
- Avoid vague plans like "I will study biology." Instead: "I will Revise cell division and do 1 exam question"
- And break subjects into small chunks
- Switch between subjects or topics
- Mix it up

Your daily 7 hour plan

9:00 – 11:00: Study Session (2 hrs). Break into short sessions of 30 minutes.

Four topics from past papers. Focus on exam questions

11:00 – 11:20 (Break)

11:20 -1.20 (2hrs) Study Session

Four topics from different subjects

- Mix revision and exam questions
- Review notes

Lunch 1:20 – 2:20

2.20– 3:20 (1hr) Study session

- Two topics
- Break 3:20-4.20

Evening: 4:20 - 5:20 (1hr) Study Session

Select one exam question from two different subjects

5:20 – 7:00 Dinner and Down Time

7:00 – 8:00 (1hr)

- Revise notes from two different subjects

ROTATOR CUFF TENDINOPATHY

Rotator cuff tendinopathy is one of the most common causes of shoulder pain affecting up to 30% of the general population. The Next World War




