WE'RE NOW INTO THE FINAL LAP

By James Kenny is a retired Guidance Counsellor and has taught at both primary and second level.

The countdown to the Leaving Cert is now really on with 5/6 weeks left. With each passing day, the exams draw closer. It's a time where every study session counts, every revision topic matters, and focus becomes more important than ever. While the challenge ahead may feel intense, it also marks the final stretch—a chance to put that bit of extra work, keep to the plan, stay consistent, and you can approach the exams with confidence.

The bulk of the work is done, this is the "tidying up" phase. Over the previous weeks I have suggested some revision and study techniques and this is the final one in the series. So, I would like to share a few closing guidelines.

The last 5/6 weeks before the Leaving Cert are less about cramming everything and more about consolidating what you already know. The students who improve most at this stage usually focus on exam strategy.

Shift your mindset from learning new content to performing well in the exam. That means doing as many past exam questions as possible under timed conditions. You'll start to notice patterns—certain topics are repeated.

Be selective with your time. Not every topic is equally important. Look at past papers and marking schemes and prioritise the high-frequency topics. It's far more effective to be strong on the core areas than vaguely familiar with everything. I would suggest you have a few "bankers" for each paper, assuming that you have the whole course covered.

At this stage, active revision beats passive revision every time. Test yourself constantly and write out answers.

Also, don't neglect timing. Many students lose marks not because they don't know the material, but because they run out of time or mismanage questions. Practice completing full questions and checking against the marking scheme.

Take care of the basics, even if it sounds obvious. Sleep, exercise and short breaks make a real difference to how well your brain actually works and find ways to relax and unwind.

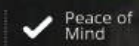

- Local musician and singer Liam Corridan.

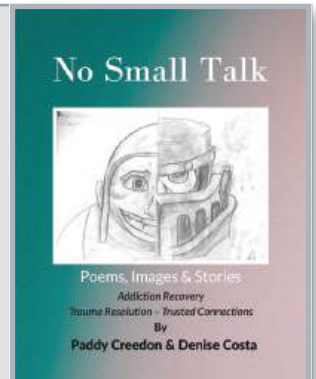

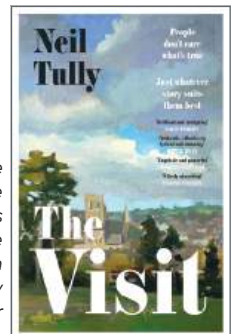

The Visit

'Brilliant and intriguing' - Colm Tóibín

"The lad is a bit like a stray dog. I keep an eye on him and throw him a few scraps. There are plenty of people in this town who'd just as soon drop him off in the wilderness and hope there's no scent to follow home. The problem is that Patrick could find his way out of any wilderness and they wouldn't like whatever starved thing came back."



Sergeant Jim Field feels a guilty paternalism for Patrick Hatten, a young man struggling to find a job, a life and a purpose in a small-town Wexford community. Both are used to being on the fringes but while Jim is a romantic with bad health and regret, Patrick is full of anger and action, and his actions could have devastating effects.

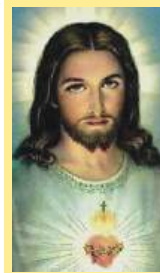

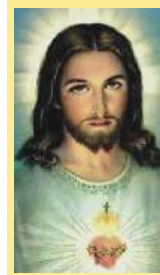

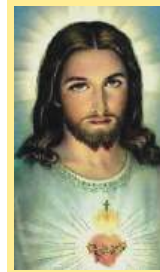
