BALLYDUFF'S DYLAN BROWNE IS EUROPE'S NATURAL STRONGMAN

Dylan Browne (25) from Ballyduff has won the championship for Europe's Natural Strongman last Saturday in Doncaster, England.

Dylan made two personal bests in the competition, with a 290kg deadlift and 130kg overhead press. He placed first in the third event where he had to carry a 340kg yoke frame on his back, 10 metres up and 10 metres down a course. Also in the last event where he had to carry a 140kg sandbag for 10 metres and then load it over a 4.5ft bar for "reps". He maintained a strong lead concluding in 5 points ahead.

The personal trainer who works at the Brandon Hotel gym says, "I surprised myself. My main goal was to qualify for Worlds. I really wasn't expecting to take the win. I'm absolutely over the moon."

Team Ireland placed three times in the top 5 and have secured entry to the World Championship this August in Glasgow.

BALLYBUNION RACES INTO SUMMER! DON'T MISS THE THUNDER OF HOOVES!

Rahavanig, Ballybunion is the place to be on Sunday, June 14th. The white flag is set to rise on another exciting season of horse and pony racing at Ballybunion Races on Sunday. Owners, jockeys and racing enthusiasts from across the region will take part in what promises to be a thrilling day.

Hooves thunder and history lives on almost 200 years at Ballybunion Races. The very first race meeting in Ballybunion took place in 1832, when horses set off from the caves on the Ladies' Strand, galloped to Kitty's River on the Long Strand, and thundered back towards a winning post, marked by a black pole aligned with The Castle. The day's highlight was the Speak Easy Cup, with a prize of five sovereigns, claimed that year by a horse named The Dodger.

Subsequent gatherings moved to Ballyeigh Strand, where spectators enjoyed a mix of games, riding contests and even a pre-arranged faction fight. The most notorious of these skirmishes erupted on 24th June 1834. History has it that, due in no small part to the disturbances surrounding these faction fights, the meeting at Ballyeigh was suspended and by 1856, after the final Ballyeigh fixtures on 9th and 10th September, records show that horse racing found its new home in Listowel. The inaugural Listowel meeting in 1858 launched a tradition that endures to this day.

The great local race tradition was revived again on the sands of Ballybunion Beach in 2019 and hosted in a field in Ballyeigh in 2023 - the story has come almost full circle! Last year, Ballybunion Races found a new home at Rahavanig - less than two miles outside town - and the spirit of racing gallops on this year too in Rahavanig. So, whether you're a racing enthusiast or simply looking for a great family day out, feel the thunder of hooves and the unmistakable buzz of race day in Rahavanig on Sunday, June 14th. The first race is set for off at 1 o'clock.

The weekend will also include Mass in Irremore Church on Sunday morning featuring participating harpists, before concluding with a special performance at the historic Rattoo Round Tower.

The Cornelius Lyons Harp Festival continues to build on the success of its inaugural year and aims to strengthen awareness of North Kerry's rich harping tradition while creating opportunities for learning, performance and community engagement.



There are some great benefits from being active for eg more energy , more upbeat, good mood, weight loss, inch loss, better body shape, so whats not to love about becoming more active.

SLEEP = We all know how a bad nights sleep can have an impact on us compared to a good nights sleep.

A poor nights sleep can leave you feeling tired, irritable , moody and more likely to reach for high sugary foods to give you that energy boost.

Where as a good nights sleep can leave you feeling energised, alert, full of vitality and ready to take on the world.

HYDRATION = Healthy guidelines recommend that you drink 1 and a half to 2 litres of water a day.

Ask yourself are you drinking enough water , and if not what is stopping you?

The benefits of drinking water are it is like a detox for the body, helps with fluid retention, improves our skin. Very often you can think you are hungry when it is actually more thirsty that you are.

Like we said at the beginning your chair needs 4 sturdy legs to support you , you also need to keep in mind the 4 pillars of weight loss and wellness.

EYES IN THE SUN

Too much sun can damage the eyes. As with skin damage, it is the ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun which causes problems. There are two types of UV rays: UV-A and UV-B.

Over time, the effects of UV rays may help cause several eye problems.

UV-A

Can hurt your central vision. It can damage the macula, a part of the retina at the back of your eye.

UV-B

The front part of your eye (the cornea and the lens) absorbs most UV-B rays, but these rays may cause even more damage to your eyes than UV-A rays.

WHAT EYE PROBLEMS CAN UV RAYS CAUSE?

Macular Degeneration

UV rays may lead to macular degeneration, a leading cause of vision loss for older people.

Cataract

UV rays, especially UV-B rays, may also cause some kinds of cataracts. A cataract is a clouding of the eye's natural lens, the part of the eye that focuses the light we see.

Pterygium

Another UV-related problem is a growth called pterygium. This growth begins on the white of the eye and may involve the cornea. Eventually, the growth may block vision. It is more common in people who work outside in the sun and wind

Skin Cancer

Skin cancer around the eyelids is also linked to prolonged UV exposure.

Corneal Sunburn

Corneal sunburn, called photokeratitis, is the result of high short-term exposure to UV-B rays.

Long hours at the beach or skiing without proper eye protection can cause this problem. It can be very painful and may cause temporary vision loss.

PROTECTING YOUR EYES FROM THE SUN

If you are spending time outdoors, especially in the summer or on holidays abroad, make sure that you and your children have good quality, dark sunglasses with UV protection.

Look for the British Standard (BS EN ISO 12312-1:2013) or the CE mark, which is the manufacturer's assurance that the sunglasses have been made to the appropriate safety standards.

You can also protect your eyes by making sure to wear a hat with a brim or a sun visor in bright sunlight.

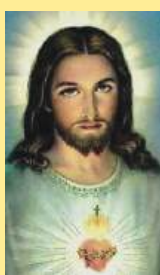

MEANING OF LIFE

"Well, in my opinion, death is a revolving door of departing from and returning to Earth. We will keep coming back until we make ourselves perfect and ready for eternity."

The above excerpt from a TV debate about life after death got me thinking. When answering questions about what happens after we die, we really have only two sources to consider. We can turn to human ideas—experiences, theories, and guesses—or we can turn to the Word of God. No living person has a certain answer (after all, the only people who truly know are no longer here!). But the One, true and living God knows all things—past, present, and future. He has the sure answer, and He has not left us to wonder or speculate.

transformed bodies for eternity. As 1 Corinthians 15:51–52 says: *"Behold! I tell you a mystery: 'We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed—in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.'"*

The thought of returning again and again to this earth is my worst nightmare! Once around is enough for me. And as for achieving perfection by my own efforts—forget it. Impossible.

The most wonderful news is that God has done it all for us. When I became a believer, God credited to me the perfect righteousness of Jesus Christ. I cannot earn salvation through good deeds. Only Jesus' death on the cross secures my salvation. Do I fully understand this? No, not at all. But I believe it because God says it in His Word: *"For He (God) made Him who knew no sin (Jesus) to become sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."* (2 Corinthians 5:21)

I can never make myself perfect, no matter how many lifetimes I might have.

God's amazing grace, His outrageous love, and His incredible sacrifice accomplish for us what we could never, ever do for ourselves.
