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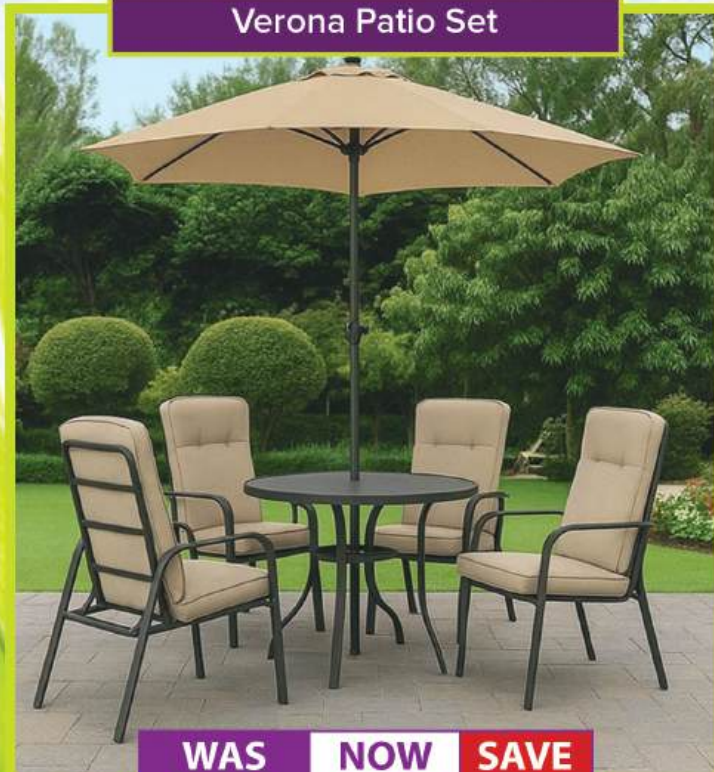

DEMENTIA INCLUSIVE LISTOWEL

The Dementia Inclusive Listowel working group have decided to establish a Dementia Café in Listowel.

The idea of developing Dementia Inclusive Listowel was promoted in 2022 following a public meeting facilitated by the Ard Churam team under the chairmanship of Finbarr Mawe, representatives from the HSE Community Work Department and the Listowel Business and Community Alliance represented by its chairperson, Rose Wall.

Over 30 people a day are diagnosed with dementia in Ireland. Listowel and the surrounding areas are working to create a town that values and welcomes people with dementia and their loved ones so that they can remain connected and included in community life. Dementia Inclusive Listowel is an inter-agency group made up of business and community interests. It aims to make the community a place where people living with dementia are welcomed, understood, and supported.

Since 2022 the group have organised numerous dementia awareness workshops / events including Dementia awareness workshops for staff in local businesses, a Brain Health event was delivered in Listowel where over 200 people attended. A booklet was produced last year which documented the work of the group to date and is available by contacting Ard Churam Day Care Centre on 068-22986.

This year the Dementia Inclusive Listowel working group have decided to establish a Dementia Café in Listowel. The café will be a space where people with Dementia, their families or carers can come to meet, have a cuppa and relax.

The Fuchsia Café will be held in the Listowel Arms on the last Tuesday of every month from 10.30am – 12pm.



HAULIERS' NATIONAL CONFERENCE TO TAKE PLACE AT PIVOTAL MOMENT FOR IRELAND'S TRANSPORT INDUSTRY

The Irish Road Haulage Association (IRHA) will hold its Annual Conference at the Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney, on Friday, September 4 and Saturday, September 5, 2026, at what industry leaders are describing as a defining moment for the future of Irish road transport. Thousands of hauliers and transport operators from across the country are expected to roll into Killarney for the two-day event, which comes as the sector grapples with rising fuel costs, increasing regulatory pressures and growing concerns over the future competitiveness of Irish haulage.

The conference will bring together senior Government figures, policymakers and industry leaders for what is expected to be a significant discussion on the future direction of the transport sector. Minister for Climate, Environment, Energy and Transport, Darragh O'Brien TD, will address delegates at the conference gala dinner on Saturday evening, alongside Minister of State at the Department of Transport, Seán Canney TD.

Other political speakers include Michael Healy-Rae TD, who will address delegates on Friday evening, and MEP Cynthia Ni Mhurchú, who will speak on Saturday afternoon. Carol Nolan TD and Sean Kelly MEP will also attend the conference.

Outside the Gleneagle Hotel, a major display of vintage trucks will celebrate Ireland's rich haulage heritage, while manufacturers and suppliers will showcase the latest heavy goods vehicles, trailers and transport technology, creating one of the country's largest public displays of commercial vehicles for public viewing.

IRHA President Ger Hyland said this year's conference comes at a watershed moment for the transport industry and cautioned that Government plans to unwind fuel supports risk placing unsustainable pressures on hauliers already facing escalating costs.

According to Hyland: "The attendance of both Ministers with responsibility for transport underlines the importance of the issues facing our industry. Hauliers are once again dealing with rising fuel prices at a time when operating costs remain exceptionally high. We believe now is not the time to withdraw fuel supports, and that message will be delivered directly to Government during our conference."

Hyland went on to say: "Any decision to wind down fuel supports at this time would drive inflation and have a severe impact on households and families across the country who would see higher food, and transport costs – driving the cost of living crisis to unsustainable levels. Adding 30 cents back onto a litre of fuel will mean that many haulage businesses simply will not make it to Christmas"

Hyland appealed to the government to listen to the transport sector and delay any unwinding of the supports until a more stable peace is achieved in the Middle East. With senior ministers, TDs, MEPs and transport operators gathering in one place, the IRHA Annual Conference is expected to generate significant discussion on fuel policy, fuel supports, transport regulation, decarbonisation and the future of Ireland's supply chain.

KENNELLYS WELCOMES PROGRESS ON RIVER FEALE CLEARANCE WORKS IN LISTOWEL

Senator Mike Kennelly and Cllr Aoife Kennelly have welcomed confirmation from the Office of Public Works (OPW) that long-awaited vegetation clearance works on the River Feale at Listowel Bridge are scheduled to commence from 1 September 2026, following representations he made in Seanad Éireann last May.

In a follow-up response to Senator Kennelly's Seanad intervention on 19 May 2026, Minister of State Kevin Boxer confirmed that the OPW intends to begin the removal of trees and scrub vegetation downstream of Listowel Bridge. The works, which are expected to take between one and two weeks, are aimed at improving river flow and reducing potential flood risks in the area.

Welcoming the update, Senator Kennelly said: "I raised the condition of the River Feale at Listowel Bridge in the Seanad earlier this year and sought urgent action from the OPW. I am pleased to receive confirmation that vegetation clearance works will commence from 1 September. These works are important in maintaining the river channel and addressing concerns that have been consistently raised by local residents and businesses."

The OPW has advised that the timing of the works is subject to environmental regulations, including restrictions during the bird nesting season. The project is also complicated by the presence of invasive plant species, including Japanese knotweed and Himalayan balsam.

Senator Kennelly noted that further discussions will be required regarding the removal of gravel deposits on the river island, with these works likely to take place next summer subject to environmental approvals and agreement with Inland Fisheries Ireland.

"While there is more work to be done, this is a positive development and demonstrates that continued engagement and advocacy can deliver progress for Listowel and the wider North Kerry area," Senator Kennelly added.

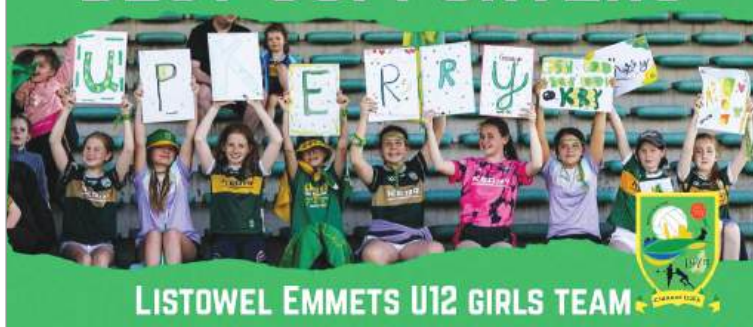
Senator Kennelly said he will continue to engage with the OPW and relevant agencies to ensure that all necessary flood mitigation and river maintenance measures are advanced for the benefit of the local Listowel and Kilocrim communities.

But with so many questions, in a family with so many secrets, it is difficult for Jack to understand the person he is becoming. How can a simple boy learn to become a king?

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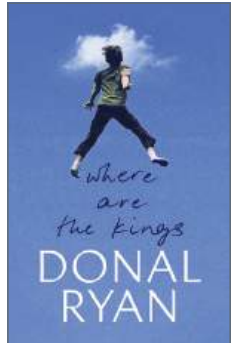

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COLOUR VISION DEFICIENCY

Most people with a colour vision deficiency (CVD) are able to see things as clearly as other people but they have difficulty distinguishing between some colours. This may have an impact upon a child's performance at school or on the sports field and can also affect career options, for example becoming an electrician or a pilot. As most people with a colour vision deficiency can see some colours. There are some people who are unable to see any colour at all, but this is very rare.

Who is affected by colour vision deficiency?
Colour vision may be affected by some eye diseases, but the most common cause of CVD is genetic. The gene for this is transmitted on the X chromosome (from your mother) and so it mainly affects men and boys, with around 8% of males and 0.5% of females having CVD. There are around 3 million people in the UK with some kind of CVD.

What are the symptoms of colour blindness?
If someone has CVD they may have difficulties distinguishing between different types of food – for example mistaking chocolate sauce for ketchup. It may also be very hard to get a child with CVD to try green vegetables as they will look unappetising. Older children may confuse the red and green lights on their games console. If you have any concerns about your child's vision, a sight test is recommended.

How do you treat colour vision deficiency?
There is currently no cure for genetic CVD. Your optometrist may suggest using colour filters on your glasses, or coloured contact lenses. People with illnesses that have led to CVD, may find that their vision returns to normal when their illness has been treated.
