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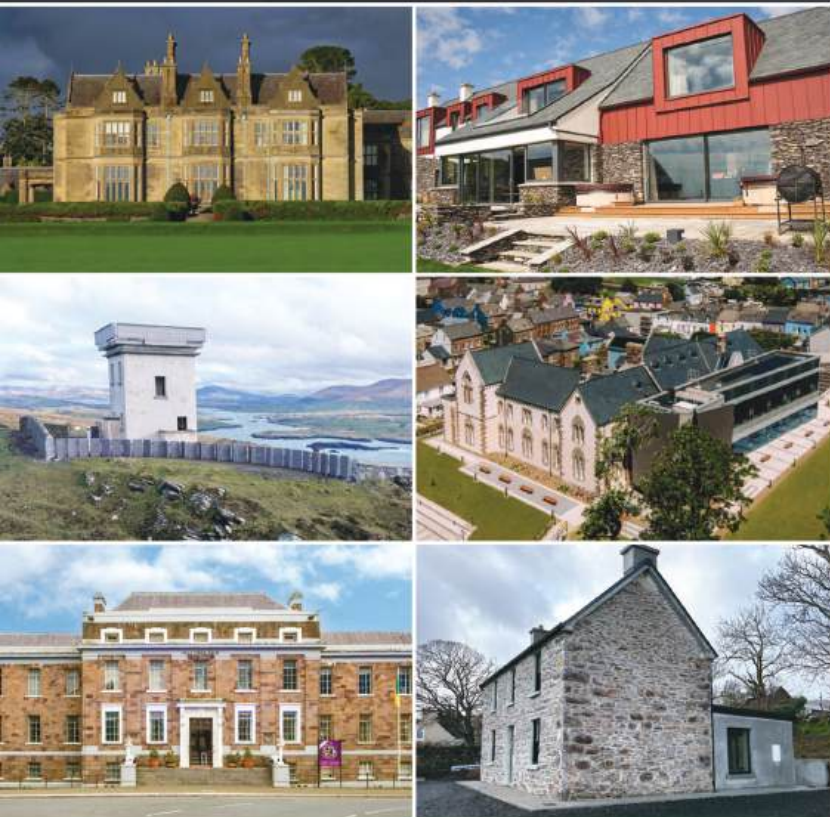

Our Creative Communities programme continues throughout the autumn, with a series of workshops and events offering opportunities to learn, participate and enjoy our local culture in a friendly and welcoming setting. The programme includes a Songwriting Circle with Donnacha Toomey, Set Dancing with Denis McCarthy, and North Kerry Music Session with Mary Crowley. These are 5-week workshops and bookings can be made via our Eventbrite page; limited spaces are available. Adult step dancing classes will also be returning this autumn.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I'M EXPERIENCING VISUAL DISCOMFORT?

Tips for avoiding visual discomfort

- Even lighting – avoid bright light sources in your field of vision. Be aware of glare from windows and consider closing curtains or blinds to reduce this
- Reduce glare from screens – adjust the screen position to reduce the glare from overhead lights
- Take regular breaks – be sure to regularly take time away from your screen or near tasks, such as reading, during your day
- Hold digital devices further away – holding phones and tablets close to the eyes involves more effort to maintain focus. Holding these devices, a little farther away can help reduce eye tiredness

If glasses are required certain lens options may help.

Blue light blocking lenses are designed for digital lifestyles which ensures more relaxed and comfortable vision.

This protective coating reduces the blue light emitted by digital screens. It is the optimal solution for people who use digital screens throughout the day, including students, gamers, young professionals, office workers and children.

SAN RITA WELLNESS

Welcome to San Rita Wellness weekly column... We hope you are safe and well.

Very often when we decide to try something, whether it's for the 1st time or the 10th time we never know where it can take us, as each time can be different with a different outcome. Setting out to achieve weight loss and overall wellness can be compared to that of a journey.

Your weight loss and wellness journey may go through different phases and speeds at various times also. For example do you remember as a child learning to ride a bike for the first time. It was exciting yet scary and you were probably a bit wobbly, but once you got going it was so easy and you loved it. A little bit like your weight loss and wellness journey on our San Rita Wellness plan, once you start to see and feel the pounds coming off it's a fantastic feeling too. But like everything else sticking to the guidelines is key in order to achieve the outcome we want.

There are six key areas that we need to be mindful of:
Planning, Shopping, Tracking, Cooking, Walking, Water

1...Planning: Planning in advance is like mapping out a route to give you direction. It could be like planning your meals in advance, Planning out some short term goals with your weight loss, Planning out some time for yourself like a walk in the park.

2...Shopping: What we put in our shopping trolley end up on the kitchen table, and what ends up on the table we are more likely to eat. We are easily tempted especially around Easter time when we do go into the supermarket with the wide range chocolate etc available. Make a list of what you really need to buy and think about how it can help you to have the right foods to hand, compared to buying other things that will only set you back on your weight loss journey.

3...Tracking: Keep a track of various things such as your food choices, your calorie allowance, your body measurements and how you feel are all key in helping you to progress. We not alone learn from the good choices we make, but we also learn from the not so good choices also.

4...Cooking: When lockdown first came into our lives many of us found ourselves cooking and indeed baking more. There are two sides to this however which may have helped or not helped. Trying out new recipes and ideas can add more interest to our meals, as it can sometimes be very easy to keep eating the same kind of foods over and over which can result in boredom and lack of variety

5...Walking: Walking can be so beneficial to our overall health and wellbeing for many reasons. Firstly it costs nothing to put on a pair of comfortable shoes. Being outdoors in the fresh air leaves us feeling energised, invigorated and motivated. With the clocks going forward this weekend this gives us an extra hour of brightness in the evenings which we should take advantage of.

6...Water: The recommended amount of water we require is between a litre and a half to two litres a day. Very often we can think we are hungry when in fact we could be more thirsty than hungry. Tips to help you drink more water would be to keep it at room temperature or try adding in some no added sugar cordial to your water.

As we said in the beginning your weight loss and wellness journey may go at different speeds at different times. You may even hit a bump on the road which can cause a flat tyre, which you will need to repair in order to get moving forward again in the right direction.

Tools of the trade

Puncture repair kit - To fix a bad day to make it a better week.

Bicycle wheel pump - To keep your motivation pumped when it gets flat.

A road map - To know where you want to go and how to get there.

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Exposed:

The Scandals that Rocked the State

By Frank Connolly



From the murky corridors of power to the empty streets of our ghost estates, Frank Connolly exposes the Ireland that decades of corruption built. Drawing on fifteen years as an investigative journalist with The Sunday Business Post and the Irish Mail on Sunday, Connolly charts the scandals that shook the State; from Charles Haughey's tenure to Bertie Ahern's 2008 resignation. His investigations helped trigger tribunals that revealed cronyism, illicit payments, and the abuse of office by politicians and business elites alike.

Exposed unearths the continuity of corruption and greed in Ireland: the Moriarty Tribunal's findings on Michael Lowry, Garda misconduct in the North-West, and the policies that seeded our disastrous housing crisis. 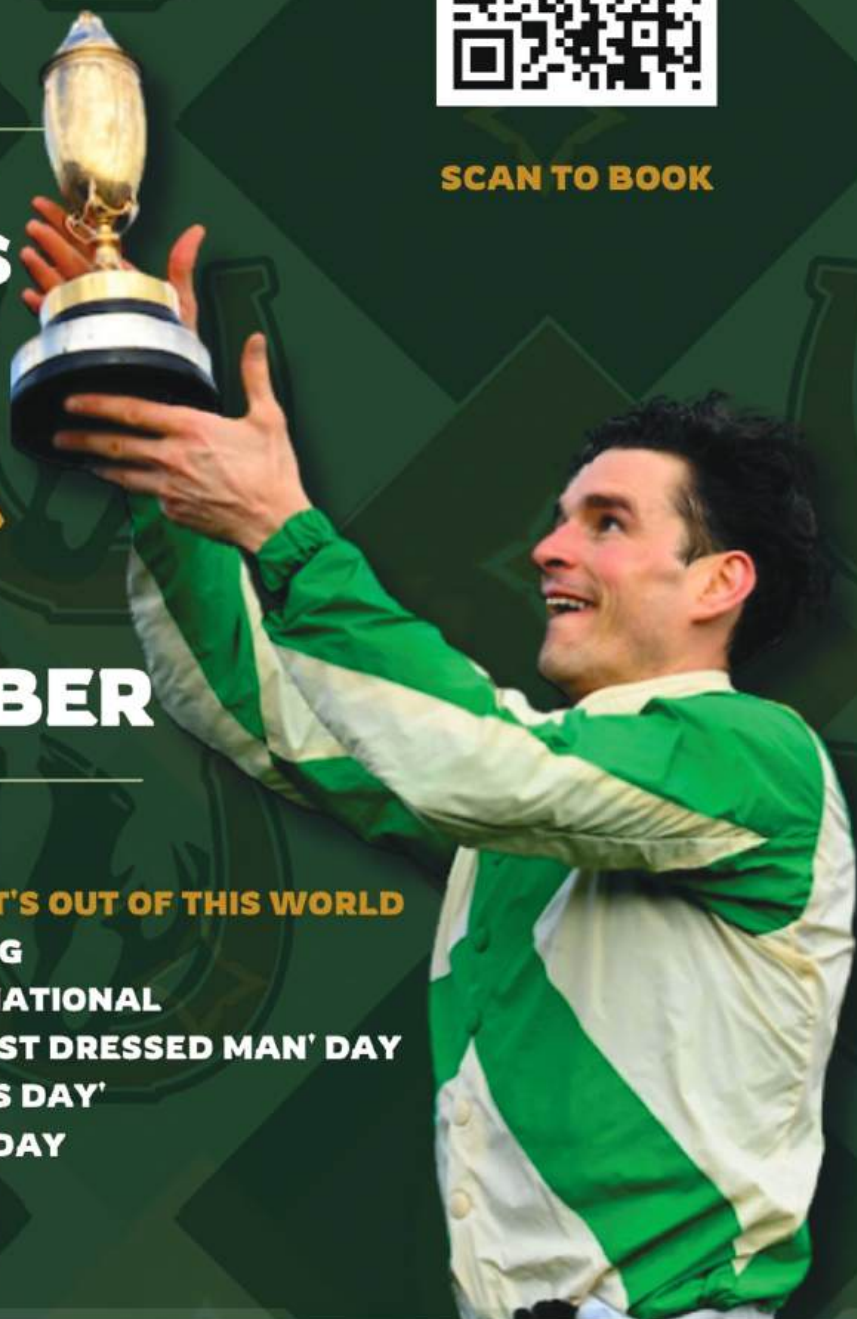

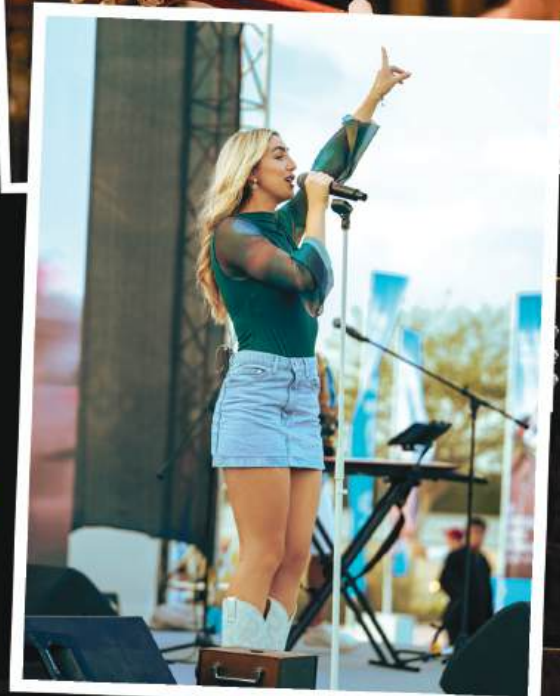

9/11 TRAGEDY

Last week people all over the world remembered the desperate Saturday of 11 September 2001, twenty five years ago when we watched on TV as the twin Trade Towers came crashing down with terrible loss of life following a terrorist attack. One man who has cause to remember was Pete Kiely, Tarbert. On that morning Pete who was working for stock broker Goldman Sachs was working on the 84th. Floor of the South Tower, the second Tower to be hit by terrorist aircraft. Just as he ran down the stairs, police and firemen were entering the building and while Pete and many others escaped with their lives, many others unfortunately did not, beannacht Dé le hanamacha na marbh and hopefully we will never witness its likes again.

REMEMBERING PEADAR O'CONNELL

On Sunday last, 13 September members of Tarbert Historical Society travelled to Killimer to honour Peadar O'Connell (1775 -1826) from the area, the Bi-Centenary of whose death in 1826 was being commemorated in their fine Community Centre. Peadar had two claims to fame which were articulated and discussed. A native of Cahirciveen and a teacher in the area he was the Kerryman who allowed Ellen Hanly, the Cailín Bawn who was murdered off Moneypoint in 1819 to be buried in Birrane graveyard in his own grave. He was a distinguished scholar and lexicographer who compiled the first Irish / English dictionary which was on loan from Trinity College for the occasion. He was also a relation of Daniel O'Connell who won the Clare Election to the British Parliament in 1829. The Community Centre is very impressive was established some 13 years ago with its own Museum, and was opened by Jimmy Deenihan T.D. then Minister for Arts and Culture.

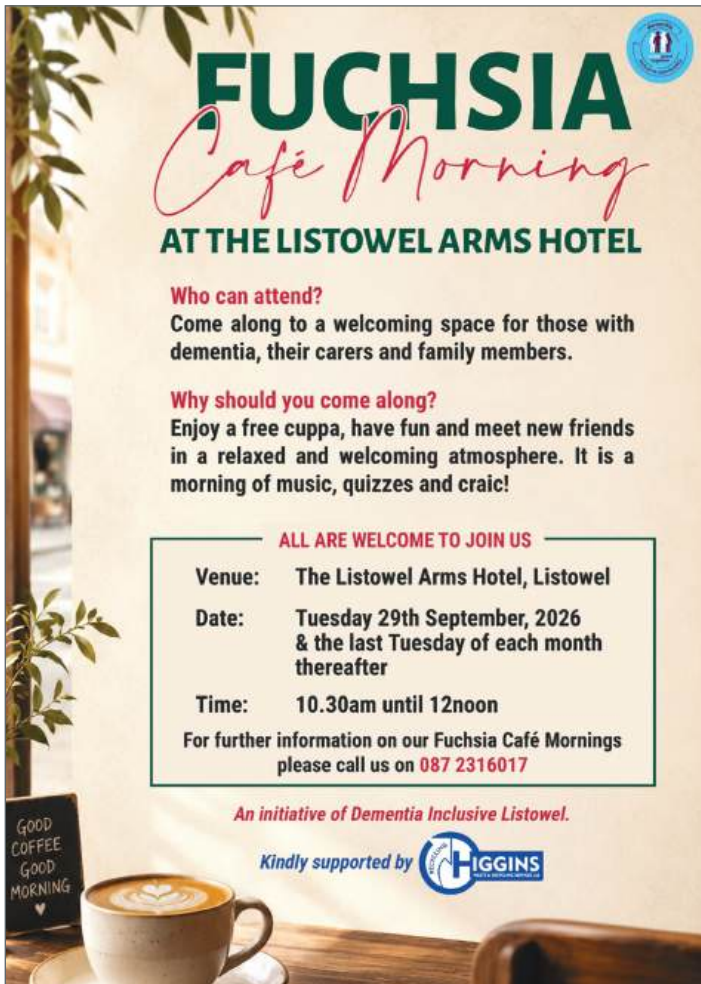

A BIT OF HISTORY

The piece that I have included below came from a historian called Liam Kenny who lives in Naas. Is there anyone out there that has any idea who this family was and what connection they had with Moyvane. The 100th anniversary of his death will be September 21 which is Monday of next week and it would be nice to know something about him and his family.

CENTENARY OF DEATH OF YOUNG MOYVANE PILOT OFFICER

Timothy Joseph Prenderville (23) of Glenalappa, Moyvane/Newtown Sandes, died on 21 September 1926 when the aircraft he was piloting crashed near Blessington on the Wicklow/Kildare boundary. He had taken off that afternoon from Baldonnell aerodrome, base of the fledgling Irish Air Corps west of Dublin, en route for army exercises which were taking place north of Blessington. He was in the course of a simulated attack on an armoured car on the road below when his plane was seen to plunge earthwards. Officers observing nearby ran to the crash site and found him dead in the wreckage; his observer, Lieut Edmond O'Reilly was extricated but he too died on his way to hospital.

Timothy Prenderville's funeral took place to Glasnevin cemetery following requiem Mass in Arbour Hill church. Senior figures from government and military attended the obsequies including a formal procession with his coffin covered with the tricolour on a horse-drawn carriage being taken through the city. At the time of his death his family members were; Julia his mother, Michael his father, Cornelius/Neil brother who was in the army in Dublin, Michael's brother who was a student at St Michael's College, Listowel. Julia sister - at home Moyvane. Margaret, sister, Sister of Mercy, Florida, USA. Julia Prenderville applied to the State for some compensation following her son's death pointing out that he supported her from his army salary. Eventually after enlisting the help of Kerry public representatives she was allocated a small compensation sum. Her nephew, James Harte, manager of Ballylongford Creamery was a big help in her campaign. It would be interesting to know if there are any connections of Timothy Prenderville in north Kerry one hundred years later and if there are they might be interested in thinking of his sad demise in the service of the new Irish state, one hundred years ago this month. *You will encounter variations in the spelling of the surname - Prendville, Prendeville, etc.

1. 1877 Michael Prenderville, father of Timothy Prenderville (the pilot who died on 21-09-1926) was born on 1 Sept 1877 in Kilcusan which I believe is on the Brosna road out of CASTLEISLAND which is not far from Moyvane and certainly within the north-east Kerry area.
2. 1902 Michael Prenderville marries Ellen Hourihan from near Clonakilty, Co Cork. This at least tells us that Michael Prenderville did not marry-in to Moyvane.
3. 1911 Michael Prenderville and Ellen are living at Castle-town, Co Limerick with their young family where he is a creamery manager.

4. 1926 In a report on the Military Pensions file following Timothy's death in the air crash the family is described as: Ellen (mother), Cornelius - Army in Dublin, Julia - living with an aunt, Margaret nun in Florida, Timothy (deceased) & Michael junior, student, & living with his mother Ellen.
5. 1926 Census lists Ellen and Michael junior only living at Glenalappa.
6. 1920s Michael Prenderville, senior, for whatever reason seems to have left is native Kerry and the family in the mid 1920s and moved to mid Co Kildare. He lives to an extraordinary 89 years, dies in 1966, and is interred at Athy, Co Kildare.
7. Working through the Marriages and Deaths records I tried to find matches for Cornelius, Julia and Michael by co-relating the ages of people of those names on the BMD with their ages as shown on the 1911 Census.
8. 1940 The only one I could match confidently was Michael junior, described as a teacher, who married Nora O'Sullivan, of Cork City in 1940
9. 1974 Michael junior died in 1974 in Cork City.
10. 1980 A son of Michael described as Dr Gerard Prenderville marries in Kerry in 1980. I am not certain whether this Dr Gerard Prenderville is still alive. He is the only confident connection of Timothy Prenderville (died 1926) in a later generation that I could find. If only I knew somebody who knew the medical profession in Cork to establish whether this man is still to the good or had family. This would be important in tracing a modern connection to Timothy Prenderville of 1926.
11. 1926 Back to Timothy Prenderville of 1926, all the news reports of his accident, inquest and funeral, including in local papers titled 'the Kerry Reporter' and 'the Kerry News' (both later absorbed into 'Kerryman') consistently give his home place as NEWTOWNSANDES. This and his father's birthplace outside Castleisland suggest a solid connection with east Kerry even if there is no one of that name in the immediate Moyvane locality.
12. Interestingly 'the Kerryman' carries a note two years later in which it contrasts the Govt reaction to the death of Kevin O'Higgins, Minister for Justice assassinated in 1927, and whose family received £20,000 ex gratia from the State with the state's failure to compensate the mother (Ellen Prenderville) of Timothy Prenderville who died in the service of state in 1926. It's an interesting political note to see in the paper. Shortly afterwards Ellen did receive a mere £200.

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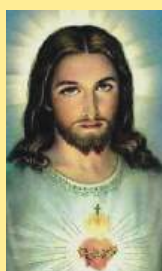
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THE MIRACLE PRAYER

MEANING OF LIFE

"I believe that what goes around comes around, so he got his Karma. Good enough for him."

The words, spoken with such venom, got me thinking. The Hindu and Buddhist belief in Karma and the biblical truth of reaping what we sow can, at first glance, appear rather similar. Both recognise that our actions have consequences. However, that's where the comparison ends. As a Bible-believing Christian, the Word of God is the highest authority for me, and its message cannot be mixed or diluted with a bit of Karma here and there.

Yes, Galatians 6:7 clearly says:

"Do not be deceived, God is not mocked, for whatever a man sows, that shall he also reap."

That is true. Our choices and actions do have consequences. But the Bible tells us something much deeper about the human condition. Romans 3:23 reminds us:

"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

If we all simply received exactly what our sins deserved, what hope would any of us have? But... **We have Jesus.**

This is where the Gospel is so radically different from Karma. Scripture reveals that Jesus lived a sinless life and died a brutal death so that sinful people like us could be forgiven and reconciled to God.

Psalm 103:10 expresses it beautifully:

"He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities."

Now that is certainly not Karma! That is Grace.

Look also at Lamentations 3:22-23:

"Through the Lord's mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness."

And again Psalm 103:8 reminds me:

"The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."

Isn't it absolutely astonishing that God forgives our sins?

There is no waiting for Karma, or for some cold, impersonal force to balance our good deeds against our bad deeds over a succession of lifetimes. Instead, there is a loving and merciful God who offers forgiveness to us through Jesus Christ.

Psalm 103:12 is wonderfully clear:

"As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us."

And the One, True and Living God actually invites us to come to Him:

"Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)

The Gospel gives us something infinitely better than Karma. It gives us grace—God's mercy and forgiveness offered to undeserving people through Jesus Christ.

And that's very good news indeed.
