CULTURE NIGHT CELEBRATED ACROSS THE KINGDOM

More than 60 events across Kerry's five Municipal Districts brought communities together in a county-wide celebration of culture. Culture Night Kerry 2026 has been hailed as a wonderful celebration of creativity and community, following a memorable evening of events across the county on Friday, 18 September.

From music, dance and live performance to exhibitions, workshops, storytelling, film, heritage and family events, this year's programme offered an exceptionally broad snapshot of cultural life in Kerry. Established cultural venues opened their doors alongside libraries, community spaces, heritage locations and other venues, bringing Culture Night into the heart of communities across the Kingdom.

The programme drew on Kerry's strong cultural traditions while also reflecting the richness of contemporary life in the county. Irish and English could be heard throughout the programme, alongside the voices, music, stories and creative traditions of communities from many different backgrounds who now call Kerry home.

One of the standout moments of Culture Night Kerry 2026 was RTÉ's live national Culture Night television broadcast from Killarney. The broadcast put Kerry centre stage in the national Culture Night celebrations and offered audiences throughout Ireland a glimpse of the creativity, character and cultural energy of the county.

There was strong local support across the five Municipal Districts throughout the evening, with the Cathaoirleach of each district visiting key Culture Night events and meeting artists, performers, organisers, volunteers and audiences.

The 2026 programme also had a distinctly European dimension. As Ireland holds the Presidency of the Council of the European Union this year, a number of events were supported through Culture Ireland / Cultúr Éireann, creating opportunities for international cultural exchange. Ireland is paired with the Czech Republic (Czechia) in the Presidency cultural programme, and Kerry was delighted to welcome Czech poet Šimon Leitgeb, bringing a further international voice to the county's Culture Night celebrations.

Looking back on the success of the programme, Kerry County Council Arts Officer and Creative Ireland Co-ordinator Kate Kennelly paid tribute to everyone who contributed:

"Míle buíochas le gach éinne who helped make Culture Night Kerry 2026 such a memorable celebration. The success of the night belongs to the artists, performers, venues, community organisations, volunteers and audiences who embraced it with such generosity and enthusiasm. What was particularly special was seeing that sense of excitement spread right across the county. From our villages to our towns, people came together to experience something, make something, hear a story, enjoy a performance or simply share in the atmosphere. The RTÉ broadcast from Killarney gave us a wonderful opportunity to showcase Kerry nationally, while at the same time so many brilliant cultural experiences were unfolding in communities throughout the county."

Leas-Chathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Jimmy Moloney, said the response to Culture Night demonstrated the important place of arts and culture in communities throughout Kerry: "Culture Night was a tremendous celebration of the people, places and creativity that make Kerry such a special county. To see more than 60 events taking place across all five Municipal Districts, and communities coming out in such numbers to support them, was hugely encouraging. As the doors closed on Culture Night 2026, what remained was a strong sense of a county connected through creativity – from small, intimate gatherings to major performances and a national television spotlight.

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WHAT IS A CATARACT?

A cataract happens when the lens within your eye becomes cloudy. It can happen to all of the lens or just part of it.

There are different types of cataract, but the most common is age-related cataract, which is more common in people over 65. It can be found to some degree in almost all older people.

Risk factors

Age is the biggest risk factor for developing cataracts. Apart from age, smoking increases the risk of cataracts and often causes the cataract to develop earlier and more quickly.

Excessive exposure to sunlight and ultraviolet light can increase the speed at which cataracts develop. In some cases, people are born with cataracts.

Symptoms

Cataracts can cause your vision to become cloudy and less clear. You may notice that you're more easily dazzled by vehicle headlights, or that objects appear less colourful. Cataracts don't cause eye pain or make your eyes red

TREATMENT

At first following a sight test we may be able to prescribe new glasses that will help with changes to your vision caused by the cataract.

When this no longer helps you to see well enough, the only effective treatment is surgery. Surgery is usually only recommended once the cataract is causing problems with everyday activities, such as driving, watching television and reading.

Cataract surgery improves the vision of nearly all patients and has one of the highest success rates of all surgery.

GOVERNMENT NEEDS TO FAST-TRACK POLICY ON SOLAR ENERGY – KENNELLY

The Government needs to finalise its policy on solar energy development, so rural communities can be confident Ireland's renewable energy transition is being managed in a balanced and transparent way, a Fine Gael Senator has said. Fine Gael Senator Mike Kennelly said communities, developers and local authorities are operating in a policy gap while the new National Planning Statement system is designed.

"The move towards renewable energy is both necessary and welcome. Ireland has ambitious climate targets to achieve, and solar energy will play a significant role in helping us meet those commitments. But local communities must have confidence that appropriate safeguards are in place to protect our landscapes, heritage and rural environment," Senator Kennelly said.

The Senator said that responsibility for drawing up the policy for solar energy rests with Darragh O'Brien, Minister for Climate, Energy and the Environment and will form part of a National Planning Statement. He pointed to recent parliamentary questions, which confirm the guidance is in preparation but has yet to be finalised.

"Recent Solar applications in North Kerry demonstrates why we need a coherent national approach. There is broad recognition of the importance of renewable energy, but communities want assurances that developments are being planned responsibly and that local concerns are being heard.

"This shouldn't be presented as a choice between protecting our environment and achieving our climate goals, we must deliver both. A robust national framework, covering site selection, environmental impact, visual impact, community consultation and long-term land management, would give communities clarity and give investors certainty," Senator Kennelly said.

Senator Kennelly confirmed he will continue to raise the matter directly with Minister O'Brien "Communities in North Kerry and right across rural Ireland deserve a firm timeline for when this National Planning Statement will be published. We can meet our climate objectives while protecting the character of rural Ireland, but only if the guidelines are put in place without further delay."

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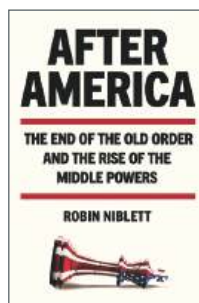
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After America:

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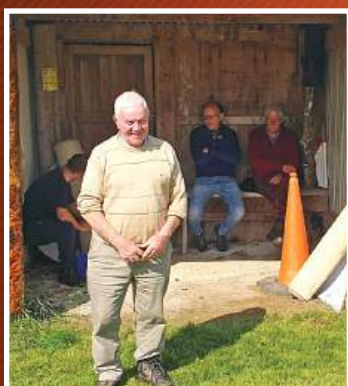
